ORDINANCE NO. 3

On motion of Councilor Isidro Tizon, seconded by  
Councilor Teodorico Sungahid,

BE IT RESOLVED, to adopt "A PROHIBITORY ORDINANCE  
ON LOOSE OR ASTRAY ANIMALS AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR  
VIOLATION THEREOF".

BE IT ORDAINED by the Municipal Board of the City  
of Ormoc and by authority of the same, that:

SECTION 1.- Henceforth, no person or persons, firm  
or corporation shall be allowed to let loose or leave astray,  
purposely or otherwise, hogs, goats, sheep, and large cattle  
within the jurisdictional limits of the City of Ormoc.

SECTION 2.- For purposes of this ordinance, loose  
or astray animals shall be seized and held by authorized  
agent of the city government until they are claimed and re-  
covered by the owners within a period hereinafter specified.

SECTION 3.- The following are the impounding fees of  
loose or astray animal which shall be paid to the office of  
the City Treasurer or his duly authorized representative, to  
wit:

Hog, goat & sheep .....	P1.00 a day
Large cattle .....	2.00 " "

SECTION 4.- Impounded animal or animals not claimed

and recovered within a period of one (1) week shall be forfeited in favor of the city government.

SECTION 5.- The City Treasurer is duly authorized to sell at public auction immediately once the animal or animals are forfeited in favor of the city government; PROVIDED, however, that the real owner or owners thereof shall be given preference in the purchase of the animals so forfeited, for their recovery, at prices respectively fixed by the highest bidders.

SECTION 6.- Any person or persons, firm or corporation found violating the provision of Section 1 of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than ₱20.00 or an imprisonment of not more than ten (10) days, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.


SECTION 7.- All previous ordinances or portions thereof in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8.- This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.


