RESOLUTION NO. 69

The Board, on motion of Councilor Cleto P. Evangelista,
seconded by Councilor Pablo S. Pajaron,

RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to adopt the
following "Gas Station Ordinance, to wit, viz:

ORDINANCE NO. 1

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE ESTABLISHMENT, OPERATION
AND MAINTENANCE OF GAS STATIONS IN ORMOG CITY.

Section 1.- This ordinance shall be known and cited
as the "Gas Station Ordinance."

Section 2.- For the purposes of this ordinance, gas
shall include gasoline, petroleum, oil, crude or otherwise,
as well as its by-products, which is or may be used for
combustion, fuel, grease, etc. of plants, cars, motors, etc.

Section 3.- Any person, firm or corporation desiring
to establish, operate and maintain a gas station shall
fill out an application therefor with the office of the
City Engineer, who shall, after a thorough inspection of the
premises described in the application, recommend its ap-
proval or disapproval to the City Mayor, according as
same is found fit or otherwise, for the purpose.

Section 4.- No gas station shall be established,
operated and maintained henceforth within the Poblacion,
Ormog City, unless: (1) it is, at least, three hundred
(300) lineal meters away from the nearest existing gas
station (2) the lot on which it is to be located has an
area of, at least, three hundred (300) square meters;
(3) the premises are so constructed and equipped in standard
form as to minimize fires, explosions, risks, etc. that
may arise from the conduct of its business; and (4) the pre-
mises are approved by the Chief of the Fire Department.

Section 5.- In the conduct of its business, no gas
station shall permit motor vehicles to park in its premises
to pick up passengers, use it as a temporary garage, or for
any other purpose than to get service therefrom incident
to its lawful business.

Section 6.- No gas station shall be permitted to open, operate or maintain its business unless the applicant, operator, owner, or otherwise, pays in addition to the usual license fees, an inspection fee of twenty pesos (P20.00) to include those gasoline station already established and operated.

Section 7.- This ordinance shall apply only to stations established, operated and maintained for commercial purpose.

Section 8.- Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall be punished with an imprisonment of not more than six (6) months, or a fine of not more than two hundred pesos (P200.00) or both, in the discretion of the court. In the case of artificial persons, the manager, director, treasurer, or their officer shall be held criminally responsible.

Section 9.- This Ordinance shall take effect upon approval.
