RESOLUTION NO. 51

The Board, on motion of Councilor Alvaro I. Gutierrez, seconded by Councilor Usualdo F. Laguitan;

BE IT RESOLVED, as is hereby resolved, to adopt

AN ORDINANCE ON SANITARY DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE,
REFUSE AND RESIDUE WITH PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF
-000-

BE IT ORDAINED by the Municipal Board of Ormoc City, that

SECTION 1. Gargage, refuse and residue shall be under proper disposal by the head of the family by which they were produced or from which they come.

shall include all perishable matter which is liable to ferment, decay, putrify, decompose or become offensive, or is a menace to health, and the refuse matter from kitchen, dining rooms or other parts of hotels, restaurants, panciterias, carenderias, boarding houses, market compound and the refuse or fruits and wegetables from fruit stands, market groceries, animal matter, any particle or meat unfit or not intended for immediate market and to be subjected to a rendering process. The term "residue" includes chewed sugar cane, banana peel, corn peel (pakpak) corn shall (agungal) nangka pewl which breed flies and other insects. Finally, the term "refuse" includes all yeard screenings, dirts, rags, waste papers, metal cans, broken glasses porcelain, cut hair (barber shops and beauty parlors) dean animals, rubbish, ashes, excretas (human and animals).

SECTION 3.- Garbage, refuse and residue shall be properly collected at homes in covered receptacles which shall be placed along the street for collection and proper disposal by the city garbage team somewhere to places designated by the authorities.

(resolution numbered 51, ordinance numbered 2, s. 1955)

SECTION 4.- It is unlawful to throw or leave any garbage, refuse, or residue or any part thereof on any street, ditch or canal, seashore, river or creek or an any yard or premises.

SECTION 5.- In sections of the city where there are garbage receptacles placed by the Health Department, any garbage, refuse or residue, except dear animals, human or animal excreta, may be placed in these receptacles to hold it. In no case shall refuse or residue be placed in a filled up garbage receptacle so as to impede the closing thereof or to cause the scattering of the refuse or residue of said receptacles.

SECTION 6.- Any person or persons violating or assisting in the violation of any part or parts of this ordinance shall upon conviction, be punished with a fine of not more than TWENTY-FIVE PESOS (\$25.00) or by imprisonment of not more than FIVE (5) days, or both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 7.- All previous ordinance or portions thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8.- This ordinance shall apply only to the poblacion, Ormoc City, and shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

SECTION 9.- Let copy of this ordinance be furnished each to the Hon. Executive Secretary, Malacañang, Manila; the Hon. City Mayor; City Treasurer; City Auditor; City Attorney; Municipal Judge; Chief of Police; City Health Officer; Fire Chief; all of Ormoc City; and to the City Engineer; and copies to be posted in public places, all of Ormoc City.
