"RESOLVED, to adopt:

ORDINANCE NO. 12-A.

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ANNUAL PERMIT AND INSPECTION ON ALL  
BUSINESSES, TRADES OR OCCUPATIONS, PRESCRIBING FEES  
THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED, by authority of the Municipal Board of Ormoc City,  
Philippines, pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act 179, as amended  
by Republic Act 429, otherwise known as the Charter of Ormoc City, That:

SECTION 1. Fees. - There shall be paid to the City Treasurer for  
every permit issued by the City Mayor for businesses, trades or occu-  
pations hereinbelow enumerated with the following schedule:

1. Sugar centrals:
  - a) with gross production of 1,000,000 piculs or over .. ~~20,000.00~~
  - b) with gross production of less than 1,000,000  
but over 500,000 piculs ..... 10,000.00
  - c) with gross production of 500,000 piculs or less .... 2,500.00
2. Candle or soap factory:
  - a) with machinery ..... 100.00
  - b) without machinery ..... 20.00
3. Manufacturer of coconut oil, lard or boiling fat:

1. Persons engaged in public market places exclusively in the sale at retail of fruits, vegetables, game, poultry, fish and other domestic food products whose total stock in trade on any one day exceeds Twenty Pesos;	



2. Peddlers and sellers at fixed stands and other similar selling places engaged exclusively in the sale at retail of fruits, vegetables, game, poultry, fish and other domestic food products whose total stock in trade on any exceeds a retail value of Thirty Pesos;
  3. Producers of commodities of all classes working in their own homes consisting of parents and children living as one family when the value of each day's production by each person capable of working is not in excess of Five Pesos;
  4. Owners of animal-drawn two-wheeled vehicles; and
  5. Agricultural products and the ordinary sale when sold, bartered or exchanged in this country by the producer or owner of the land where produced, whether in their original state or not.
- d) Those subject to municipal taxes only but not falling under letters a, b, and c or this number ..... ₱ 2.00
- e) Those subject not to any municipal tax but which in the interest of public health and welfare the Mayor may deem to regulate, including persons slaughtering animals in the city slaughter houses and vendors in the public market not falling under letters a, b, c and d of this number ..... 1.00
- f) Those for which the City is not empowered to license or to tax ..... Exempt
- PROVIDED; HOWEVER, That permits issued after June 30 each year shall be charged for at fifty percentum (50%) of the prescribed annual rate; PROVIDED, FURTHER, That nothing herein shall be construed as aggregating or repealing the provisions of other ordinances prescribing license fees for the operation of any business or the exercise of any trade or occupation, or for the inspection of machinery or other equipment; and PROVIDED, FINALLY, That in case of change of ownership or location of the business, it shall be the duty of the owner, agent or manager of each business to secure a new permit and pay the corresponding permit fee as in the case of a new business.

SECTION 2. Term of permits. - Permits shall be granted for a period of not more than one year and shall expire on the 31st of December next following the date of issuance thereof.

SECTION 3. Renewal of permits. - Every permit shall be renewed within the first twenty (20) days of January following its expiration.

SECTION 4. Permits for existing businesses, trades or occupations. - All persons or firms now licensed to operate businesses, trades or occupations subject to permits as provided for in Section 1 hereof shall file applications for such permits thirty (30) days after the approval of this Ordinance for this calendar year and not later than January 20 of each succeeding calendar year; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, partnership, firm, corporation or entity and the like to operate any business, trade or industry in Ormoc City without first securing the necessary permit from the City Mayor.

SECTION 5. Penalties. - Any violation of this Ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Two Hundred Pesos (₱200) or an imprisonment of not more than six (6) months, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court. If the violation is committed by a firm or corporation, the manager or managing director or persons charged with the management of the business of such firm or corporation shall be criminally responsible therefor: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That failure to renew a permit within the period prescribed in Section 4 of this Ordinance shall be subject to a penalty of Five Pesos (₱5) which shall be payable in the same manner and at the same time as the regular permit.



SECTION 6. Repeal. - All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.


SECTION 7. Effectivity. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.





ORDINANCE NO. 12

AN ORDINANCE REVERTING THE SUM OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY PESOS (P250) FROM OUT OF ITEM 38, C-15, PAGE 10, 1964-1965 ORMOC CITY BUDGET FOR TRAVELING EXPENSES OF A SECURITY AND UTILITY MAN FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CHOICE OF COUNCILORS ALFARO AND ABAS IN THEIR OFFICIAL MISSION TO MANILA

BE IT ORDAINED, by authority of the Municipal Board of Ormoc City, Philippines, pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act 179, as amended by Republic Act 429, otherwise known as the Charter of Ormoc City, That:

SECTION 1. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Pesos (P250) or so much thereof is hereby reverted from Item No. 38, under the Police Department (C-15), page 10, 1964-1965 Ormoc City Budget, otherwise known as provision for one police jeep, to be made available for appropriation for the traveling expenses of a security and utility man from the Police Department of the choice of Councilors Narciso Alfaro and Francisco Abas.
