RESOLUTION NO. 90

"WHEREAS, the Honorable Chairman of the Committee on Police, Fire and Public Safety, Councilor Juanito T. Kangleon, has reported the congestion of the city jail whose capacity is only 35 to 40 prisoners but is presently occupied by 69 prisoners, 7 of which are dissular prisoners awaiting their transfer to the National Penitentiary at Muntinlupa, Rizal, while most of the other 62 are detention prisoners;

"WHEREAS, according to Councilor Kangleon, these 7 insular prisoners could not be moved to the National Penitentiary because funds appropriated for their travel have already been exhausted long before the present Administration took the reins of the Government last January;

"WHEREAS, the Officer in Charge of the Ormoc City Police Department late last year tried his best to contact the Philippine Navy for any available boat going to Manila passing Ormoc City so that these insular prisoners could have been shipped with less expense on the part of the City Government but there was none;

"WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the City Government to conduct and turn over these insular prisoners to the National Penitentiary in order that the present congestion in the city jail could partly be relieved and that the City Government will also be relieved of its responsibility of maintaining said prisoners;

WHEREAS, to transport these seven insular prisoners to the National Penitentiary would necessitate at least three police escorts in compliance with existing regulations on escorting prisoners;

"WHEREAS, upon actual computation for the travel and transportation of seven insular prisoners and three police escorts including the jeepney hire for them from the port of Manila to Muntinglupa, Rizal, the same would require no less than Six Hundfed Thirty-Nine Pesos and Fifty Centavos (\$\P639.50\$);

"NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Councilor Kangleon, seconded by the Floor Leader;

"RESOLVED, to immediately ship the seven insular prisoners now confined in the City Jail to the National Penitentiary at Muntinlupa, Rizal, with three police escorts, and do, as this Body hereby does adopt:

ORDINANCE NO. 29

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF SIX HUNDRED FORTY PESOS (\$640.00) FOR TRANSPORTATION AND TRAVEL OF SEVEN INSULAR PRISONERS WITH THREE POLICE ESCORTS TO THE NATIONAL PENITENTIARY AT MUNTINLUPA, RIZAL

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Municipal Board of Ormoc City, That:

SECTION 1. The sum of Six Hundred Forty Pesos (\$\frac{p}{640.00}\$), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of funds not otherwise appropriated in the city treasury and/or reverted from savings accruing to the Ormoc City Police Department said sum to be made available as supplemental appropriation for travel and transportation of seven insular prisoners with three police escorts to the National Penitentiary at Muntinlupa, Rizal.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

ENACTED, March 13, 1968.

"RESOLVED, FURTHER, to furnish a copy of this resolution each to the Chief of Police, the City Treasurer and the City Auditor, as well as the City Warden, all of Ormoc City;

"CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY."
