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RESOLUTION NO. 38

"WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, through its Chairman, Hon. Juanito T. Kangleon, for purposes of amending Ordinance No. 36, series of 1969, otherwise known as the "1969-1970 Ormoc City Budget," so as to implement the Minimum Wage Law for second class cities to the benefit of some one hundred seventy-four (174) employees of the City Government, submitted an explanatory note to the proposed measure which is quoted verbatim hereunder, to wit:

"With all the pending legislation of importance the first, with unanimous endorsement by both the City Mayor and the Municipal Board for immediate legislative action, is the implementation of the Minimum Wage Law in the City of Ormoc.

"From the very day we took hold of the reins of the City Government, the implementation of the Minimum Wage Law has been our obsession. Although it is a fact that this has long been overdue the delay was not because of negligence on our part but because of bankruptcy and insolvency of the City. How can the City implement the Minimum Wage Law when it cannot even give the regular salary?

"When we took over the administration of the City Government we inherited enormous debts, deficits and financial obligations. The tremendous task of restoring the financial stability of the City fell on our shoulders.

"To make our obsession a reality, the Administration then embarked on a program of austerity. Savings in every department were spent only on extreme necessity. Tax measures were updated. Revenue-raising legislations were adopted. All these measures were untimely but we introduced them for they were desperately necessary. We took the risk of being misunderstood and criticized. These steps have to be taken for these are the solid solutions to set the pace toward the amelioration of the low-income group and the ultimate progress of this City.



'Starting March 1, 1970, the lowest paid employees in the City Government shall receive from then on what is required by law - a salary of one hundred and eighty pesos (P180.00) each a month. At the beginning of the ensuing 1970-1971 fiscal year the other employees shall correspondingly receive proportionate raises. The increase may not be much but our goal is to give each and every employee enough to make them live decently - a salary which shall eventually fit a second class city.

'The Committee on Finance is, therefore, strongly recommending the passage and immediate approval of this measure for the good of the service.'

"WHEREAS, Councilor Juanito T. Kangleon also reported that after a lengthy deliberation on the proposed amendment to the 1969-1970 Ormoc City Budget and after consultation and coordination with the City Finance Department, his committee had found the means with which this august Body could provide for the salary difference and the corresponding adjustments of life and retirement insurance premiums by way of reversion of some savings in certain departments of the City Government up to the end of the current fiscal year;

"NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Councilor Kangleon, jointly seconded by the Floor Leader and Councilors Samson, Tan, Porcadilla, Mejia and Torre Villas;

"RESOLVED, to adopt:

ORDINANCE NO. 25

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 36, SERIES OF 1969, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "1969-1970" ORMOC CITY BUDGET," FOR PURPOSES OF THE MINIMUM WAGE LAW FOR SECOND CLASS CITIES, PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION THEREOF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Municipal Board of Ormoc City, That:

SECTION 1. For implementation of the Minimum Wage Law for Second Class Cities, all items under "Salaries and Wages" below the minimum in Ordinance No. 36, series of 1969, otherwise known as the "1969-1970 Ormoc City Budget," are hereby amended and/or adjusted to the rate of compensation of two thousand one hundred sixty pesos (P2,160.00) per annum each with the corresponding adjustments of the provisions for life and retirement insurance premiums under "Contingent Expenses" thereof, vis-a-vis: (effective March 1, 1970)
