RESOLUTION NO. 95

"WHEREAS, Hon. Carlos Salvatierra Tan, the lawyer, legislator, statesman and ambassador, has spent the valuable years of his life in the service of his country and people;

"WHEREAS, since his childhood in Ormoc where he was born on November 4, 1893, and where he finished his elementary education, then his secondary course at the Colegio de San Carlos in Cebu City and his Bachelor of Laws at the University of the Philippines in 1915, passing the Bar in the same year, then his marriage to the former Isabel Mirasol from Iloilo in 1932, and finally occupying several high government positions here and abroad within the gift of the Filipino nation up to his demise at the Makati Medical Center last June 11th, the late Honorable Carlos Salvatierra Tan had always and constantly led an exemplary life of Christian courage and fortitude deeply imbued with justice, fairness and righteousness along the enduring postulates of morality;

"WHEREAS, his colorful public career, first as Municipal Councilor of Ormoc, then as legislator in 1922 when he was elected first Ormocano Representative of the Second District, now Fourth Congressional District, of Leyte, then of the First District, now Third Congressional District, through 1947 when he was elected Senator, then 1948 when he was named Philippine Delegate to the United Nations together with General Carlos P. Romulo, and finally through 1965 when he was appointed First Philippine Ambassador to Brazil, South America, was one long patriotic service to the Filipino people, in general, and to the Ormocanos, in particular;

"WHEREAS, as Congressman, Carling Tan played an important role in the construction of the so-called "muro de contencion" or the retention dike along Anilao River in Ormoc City and he also caused the continuation of the road from Barrio Simangan (now San Pablo) to Barrio Dolores where through his tireless efforts the school building of Barrio Dolores was constructed and, also, he was very instrumental in the construction of the Ormoc Elementary School building which was then one of the biggest elementary school buildings in the whole archipelago;

"WHEREAS, all the foregoing facts and events have endeared Hon. Carlos Salvatierra Tan to the Filipino people and to all Ormocanos so that it is but fitting and proper that we rear in our heart of hearts a shrine of affection and emulation for him in grateful recognition for his services as a public servant and a devoted son of Ormoc then we shall have rendered "unto Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's", by way of renaming a street in Ormoc City after him;



"NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of the Floor Leader, seconded by Councilor Samson;

"RESOLVED, to adopt:

ORDINANCE NO. 50

AN ORDINANCE RENAMING SAN AGUSTIN STREET IN THE CITY  
OF ORMOC CARLOS S. TAN STREET

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Municipal Board of Ormoc City, That:

SECTION 1. San Agustin Street in the City of Ormoc is hereby renamed Carlos S. Tan Street.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.


ENACTED, July 22, 1970.

"RESOLVED, FURTHER, to direct the Office of the City Engineer to prepare and immediately post the proper street signs for purposes of this resolution-ordinance;






