RESOLUTION NO. 155

A RESOLUTION REPASSING RESOLUTION NO. 148-ORDINANCE NO.
14 DATED OCTOBER 26, 1972, ABOLISHING THE VACANT
POSITION OF SPECIAL COUNSEL IN THE LAW DEPARTMENT

"WHEREAS, His Honor, the City Mayor, returned our Reso-
lution No. 148 embodying Ordinance No. 14 dated October 26,
1972, abolishing the vacant position of Special Counsel in
the Law Department, with his veto based on the memorandum
dated November 3, 1972, of the City Fiscal, a carbon copy
of which was enclosed therewith for our ready reference,
stating: (1) that there are sufficient funds in the City
Treasury; (2) that more fiscals are needed due to the
heavy volume of cases under investigation and trial be-
fore the City Court, the Court of First Instance, and the
Circuit Criminal Court; and (3) That the administration
of justice would be greatly hampered by the abolition;

"WHEREAS, it will be recalled that the aforementioned
resolution-ordinance was enacted owing to the dwindling re-
serves in our city coffer, in other words, our unexpended
balance in the general fund is already so depleted, even as
there was presented a voucher by a former member of this au-
gust Body in the sum of one thousand seven hundred ninety
pesos (P1,790.00) covering his claim for reimbursement of
his actual and necessary representation expenses incurred
during the last six months of his incumbency from July to
December, 1971, so much so that this august Body found no
other recourse than to abolish this item in order that the
savings derived therefrom could be reverted to the general
fund with which to settle outstanding obligations among
which is the abovementioned reimbursement of representa-
tion expenses;

"WHEREAS, we would like to assure the Honorable City
Mayor that this abolished item will be restored in the fu-
ture especially if extreme necessity so demands wherein
this august Body will exert efforts to replenish the same
for the good of public service;

"NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Councilor Samson, se-
conded by Councilor Porcadilla;

SECTION 1. Abolition. - The position of Special Counsel now vacant in the Law Department is hereby abolished.


SECTION 2. Effectivity. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.


