"RESOLVED, to adopt:

ORDINANCE NO. 11

AN ORDINANCE COMPELLING THE SALE OF FISH BY THE
KILO IN THE CITY OF ORMOC, PROVIDING PENALTY
FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Municipal Board of Ormoc City,
That:

SECTION 1. Title. - This Ordinance shall be known as
the "Fish-by-the-Kilo Sale Ordinance".

SECTION 2. Compulsory sale of fish by the kilo. - The
sale of fish by the kilo, whether fresh, frozen or dried,
except salted fish, shall be compulsory in the City of Or-
moc. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer
for sale any fish subject of this Ordinance by any other
measure of capacity.

SECTION 3. Fish classification. - For purposes of this
Ordinance, fish classification is hereunder provided:

First class: Pañgalwan, tañgigi, pugapo, bahaulo,
nukos, pansat, manambo, kitong, ahaan,
mambulaw, malasugi, mahinlo, katambak,
mamsa, bañgus, sandatan and kasili;

Second class: Tamarong, hasahasa, barilis, ulisi,
alimaño, pasayan and langbay;

Third class: Bolinao, bangsi, mangsi, kiampi, sawasid,
libgaw, baruñgoy, saguksok, gurami, pagi,
iho, ubod, burot, dangit, lusod, and all
others of the same class.

SECTION 4. Vending fee. - Before any fish is sold or
offered for sale within the territorial jurisdiction of
Ormoc City, there shall be paid to the City Treasurer or
his duly authorized deputy by the vendor a vending fee in
accordance with the following schedule:

<u>Classification</u>	<u>Per Kilo Fee</u>
First class	P0.05
Second class	.04
Third class	.03

SECTION 5. Fish price. - The price of fish shall be fixed by the Price Control Board, as provided for by law.

SECTION 6. Penalty for violation. - Any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not more than one hundred pesos or an imprisonment of not more than twenty days, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court, plus payment of fees or taxes due from the violator.

SECTION 7. Repeal. - Any ordinance or portions thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 8. Separability. - If any part or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or ultra vires, said declaration shall not in any way invalidate the whole of this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. Effectivity. - This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen days after its approval.

"RESOLVED, FURTHER, to furnish a copy of this Ordinance each to the City Treasurer, the City Auditor, the City Judge, the City Fiscal, all other heads of departments and/or offices, the Market Administrator, all fish vendors, and the general public;
