"The Board, on motion of Councilor Marquez, seconded by Councilor Porcadilla:

"RESOLVED, to adopt:

ORDINANCE NO. 14

AN ORDINANCE MODIFYING ORDINANCE NO. 57, SERIES OF 1965, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE CONTROLLING AND ERADICATING RABIES IN DOGS, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Municipal Board of Ormoc City, That:

SECTION 1. Title. - This Ordinance shall be known as the "Ormoc City Anti-Rabies Ordinance of 1974".

SECTION 2. Definition of terms. - When used in this Ordinance:

- a) Anti-rabies vaccine means vaccine for immunization of dogs which is prepared in incubating chicken eggs and is composed of living but weakened rabies virus administered in a single dose of two milliliters and injected intramuscularly, or such other vaccine of equal or greater potency:
- b) Owner shall include the lawful owner, possessor, or person in custody of a dog; and
- c) Stray dogs means all dogs found wandering in streets, plazas, markets, school premises, and other public places, unaccompanied by their owners.

SECTION 3. Dog immunization, license and tag. - Every owner of dogs shall have his dogs of over five months of age properly vaccinated with anti-rabies vaccine every three years by the City Health Officer, or his duly authorized deputy, who shall issue a license certificate and a metal tag for each dog.

(a) The license certificate shall state the name of the owner, possessor or custodian of the dog; the age and description of the dog, the date of vaccination, the expiration date of immunity, the kind of vaccine used, the

person who administered the vaccination, the tag number issued, and such other details as the City Health Officer may deem necessary.

(b) The metal tag shall be impressed with a serial number and the year and shall be worn by the dog at all times suspended in a conspicuous manner from a collar.

SECTION 4. Immunization license and tag fees. - Every person whose dogs are to be vaccinated, licensed and issued tags shall, for each dog, pay to the City Treasurer the sum of two pesos (P2.00) which shall accrue to a special fund for the purpose of defraying expenses for the purchase of anti-rabies vaccines and dog tags.

SECTION 5. Vaccination station. - In the implementation of this Ordinance the City Health Officer may establish vaccination stations in the city proper and the different barrios, preferably in the health and reading centers, for such period as he may deem necessary and convenient. He may also promulgate rules and regulations for the effective discharge of his duties.

SECTION 6. Disposition of stray dogs. - All stray dogs without tags shall immediately be sold at the best obtainable price or humanly killed by the city health authorities who shall dispose of the bodies killed by burning or burial in a sanitary manner: Provided, That if such dogs are claimed by the owners before they are sold or killed, the same shall be returned to the claimants after they are properly vaccinated, licensed, issued dog tags, and the license and impounding fees paid to the City Treasurer. For this purpose, the impounding fee shall be two pesos (\$\frac{1}{2}.00\$) per day or a fraction thereof for the duration of the impounding.

All stray dogs with tags shall be impounded by the city health authorities and if not claimed within three days such dogs shall likewise be sold or humanly killed; if claimed before the expiration of the three-day period, the claimant shall first pay to the City Treasurer the impounding fee before the animal will be released to him.

SECTION 7. Owner's report. - Owners of dogs which have bitten a person should immediately report the dog bite and bring the animal to the City Health Department for examination. Any disappearance of a vaccinated dog must immediately be reported also by the owner: Provided, That in case of death of the animal the dog tag shall be surrendered to the City Health Officer.

SECTION 8. Appropriation. - The City Treasurer is hereby authorized to avail himself of the item on anti-rabies campaign program under Capital Outlays in the current appropriation for the purchase of anti-rabies vaccines and dog tags.

SECTION 9. Penalty for violation. - Any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not more than twenty-five pesos or an imprisonment of not more than ten days, or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court.

"RESOLVED, FURTHER, to funnish a copy of this Ordinance each to all heads of departments and/or offices, all Barangay Captains, and the general public by posting the same at bulletin boards of public buildings, in the City of Ormoc; "CARRIED UNAMIMOUSLY."
