PREFATORY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, at present, several concerns were raised relative to the respective capacities of the different District Barangays (District Barangay 1 to 29) in Ormoc City to deliver basic and necessary services. These concerns arose from the determination as to the non-availability in most District Barangays of basic facilities mandated by law thereby which limit or hinder the ability of some if not all district barangays in being able to efficiently and effectively respond to the needs of their residents. This, an top of some District Barangays having incomplete number of barangay and SK officials and being unable to designate the required number of barangay volunteers. A copy of the Inventory of Mandatory Facilities and List of Barangay Officials of Barangays District 1 to 29 are hereto attached as **Annexes** "A" and "B" respectively, and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, the 2015 PSA population survey record of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) shows that the number of inhabitants of many of the District Barangays (from Barangay District 1 to Barangay District 28) are less than two thousand (2,000), which is the minimum population required in Section 386 (a) of R.A. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991) for the creation of a barangay. A copy of the population survey of the existing District Barangays by the PSA is hereto attached as **Annex** "C" and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, all Local Government Units are constitutionally mandated to ensure the efficient and effective delivery of basic services to the people, while at the same time being challenged to continue performing good governance practices;

WHEREAS, Mayor Richard I. Gomez issued Executive Order Nos. 84 (dated December 4, 2019) and 109 (dated November 3, 2020) creating a study group tasked to "a. gather data and information relevant to the review and study of the capacities of the district barangays to deliver effective and efficient services; b. to formulate policy recommendation on remedial actions needed on barangays that cannot anymore meet the standards of services and facilities that should be made available at barangay level based on mandates under the Local Government Code; c. To conduct meetings and open forums necessary in the formulation of the policy recommendations; and d. To perform other tasks and functions necessary in the accomplishment of the purposes or aims of this issuance";

WHEREAS, the study group conducted survey, recorded reviews, conducted focus group discussions and interviewed the participants thereof to thoroughly review and evaluate the capacities of every District Barangay in Ormoc City in terms on the delivery of basic services, barangay facilities, population, land area and other performance indicators/factors to be considered as self-reliant local governments. In fact, various meetings, consultations and fora were held in order to come up with the actual and real sentiments of Ormocanons;

WHEREAS, the study group recommended that the merging of the different District Barangays, from Barangay District 1 to Barangay District 28, will address the concerns and issues pertaining to the capacity of the barangay to deliver the basic services to its constituents, comply with the minimum population requirements, provide for allocation of funds for various projects for larger barangays vis-à-vis barangays with lesser area and population, address the concern as to the inadequate honoraria of barangays officials, as well as resolve barangay boundary disputes. A copy of the study group recommendation is hereto attached as **Annex "D"** and form an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, on August 26, 2009, the 11th Sangguniang Panlungsod ng Ormoc enacted Ordinance No. 154 entitled "An Ordinance Merging Barangay District 6 with Barangay District 5, this City" for the purpose of merging the two (2) barangays for the reason that they have incomplete set of officials and the required number of population mandated by law was not met thereby hampering the flow of barangay development and the delivery of basic public services to the constituents. Nonetheless, the said Ordinance was not implemented and the merger did not materialize considering that there was no plebiscite conducted. A copy of the Ordinance No. 154 is hereto attached as **Annex "E"** and form an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, Section 10, Article X of the 1987 Philippine Constitution expressly provides that "No province, city, municipality, or barangay may be created, divided, merged, abolished, or its boundary substantially altered, except in accordance the criteria established in the Local Government Code and subject to approval by a majority of the votes cast in a plebiscite in the political units directly affected";

WHEREAS, Section 385 of Republic Act 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, explicitly states that: "A barangay may be created, divided, merged, abolished, or its boundary substantially altered, by law or by an ordinance of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan or Panlungsod, subject to approval by a majority of the votes cast in a plebiscite to be conducted by the COMELEC in the local government unit or units directly affected within such period of time as be determined by the law or ordinance creating said barangay. $\times \times \times$ "

WHEREAS, Section 13, paragraph b (1)(a) and (g) of the Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991 specifically provides that:

"Section 13. Naming of Local Government Units and Public Places, Streets and Structures. –

X X X X X

- (b) The sanggunian of highly urbanized cities and of component cities whose charters prohibit their voters from voting for provincial elective officials, hereinafter referred to in this Code as independent component cities, may, in consultation with the Philippine Historical Commission, change the name of the following within its territorial jurisdiction:
- (1) City barangays, upon the recommendation of the sangguniang barangay concerned;

X X X X X

(g) The change of name of any local government unit shall be effective only upon ratification in a plebiscite conducted for the purpose in the political unit directly affected.

WHEREAS, all the twenty nine (29) District Earangays have recently issued Barangay Resolutions, all expressing support and acquiescence to the merger, all stating that the redistricting would be beneficial to the people and would translate into additional resources that can be allocated towards the accomplishment of programs and projects especially government facilities;

WHEREAS, the merger of the District Barangays would lead to the professionalization of the service and standardization of salaries of barangay heads and councils which will redound to benefits for the constituents. The reduced number of barangays would also make it easier to manage on the part of the City Government apart from the fact that it would in effect help the city comply with the requirements of the Local Government Code on the set up of the barangays;

WHEREAS, under the present conditions and in consideration of all the foregoing, there is wisdom and necessity to pass an Ordinance merging the different district barangays in Ormoc City to address, among others, the concerns on the capacities of district barangays of Ormoc City to deliver basic and necessary services to its constituents, provide mandated basic facilities and population requirements, and to solve problems relating to the financial and administrative stature of some barangays that fall short of complying with the criteria and requirements under the Local Government Code of 1991. This scheme will allow the barangays to have the capacity to help the city government implement high-impact development project and further improve the delivery of basic services to its constituency;

WHEREFORE, on motion of SP Member Esteban V. Laurente, Chairman, Committee on Barangay Affairs & Rural Development, severally seconded by SP Members Tomas R. Serafica, Joan Marbie C. Simbajon, Lalaine A. Marcos, Nolito M. Quilang, Vincent L. Rama, Gregorio G. Yrastorza III, Benjamin S. Pongos, Jr., Eusebio Gerardo S. Penserga and Peter M. Rodriguez; be it

RESOLVED, to enact:

ORDINANCE NO. 046 (Series of 2020)

AN ORDINANCE MERGING BARANGAY DISTRICT 1 TO BARANGAY DISTRICT 28 AND RENAMING BARANGAY DISTRICT 29 IN ORMOC CITY AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFORE.

BE IT ENACTED by the $15^{\rm th}$ Sangguniang Panlungsod ng Ormoc in its session duly assembled, That:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. - This Ordinance shall be known as the "Ormoc Barangay Redistricting Ordinance of 2020".

SECTION 2. APPLICABILITY. The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to the:

- a. Merger of District Barangays 1 to 28;
- b. Renaming of District Barangay 29; and
- c. Integration and redistricting of the twenty nine (29) District Barangays to a total of four (4) barangays.

SECTION 3. TERRITORIAL BOUNDARIES. The twenty-nine (29) barangays of Ormoc City are hereby redistricted and reduced to only four (4) barangays.

- a. District Barangays 1 to 28 shall be merged and shall have the following territorial boundaries:
 - a.1. Barangays District Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 12, 13, 15, 17, 23, 24 and 27 shall be merged to form one (1) barangay to be known and referred to as **EARANGAY SOUTH** with the following boundaries:

b. District Barangay 29 shall remain as one (1) barangay but shall be renamed as **BARANGAY NORTH**. It shall retain its existing territorial boundaries, as follows:

SECTION 4 PLEBISCITE. The merger and renaming of the District Barangays shall be subject to the approval by a majority of the votes cast in a plebiscite to be conducted by the COMELEC in the District Barangays directly affected within ONE HUNDRED TWENTY (120) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance in accordance with Section 11 hereof, without prejudice to the enforcement of applicable national laws existing at the time of the conduct of the plebiscite.

SECTION 5. MERGER AND INTEGRATION. Upon the approval of the merger as defined in Section 4 hereof, the territorial jurisdiction and entire population of merged District Barangays shall be integrated.

SECTION 6. PUBLIC OFFICIALS AND BARANGAY ELECTIONS. The first officials of the barangays created under this Ordinance shall be elected during the next barangay elections immediately following the approval of the merger and in accordance with election laws.

All elective and appointive officials of the twenty nine (29) District Barangays shall remain in office and shall continue to provide service for their respective constituents, until their successors shall have been elected and qualified.

SECTION 7. BARANGAY PROPERTIES. Upon assumption to office of the first set of barangay officials of the barangays created under this Ordinance, the existence of the former barangays shall cease and all moneys properties and accountabilities of the old or former barangays shall be assumed by the new and succeeding barangay.

All facilities existing at the time of the cessation of the existence of the old or former barangays shall be transferred to, without cost, and administered by the new barangays created under this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. SEAT OF GOVERNMENT. The seat of government of the merged barangays shall be selected and determined by the new set of elected barangay officials taking into consideration the barangay facilities, location, accessibility, availability of transportation and communication facilities, drainage and sanitation, development and economic progress and other relevant factors.

SECTION 9. FUNDING. The costs for the implementation of this Ordinance including the expenses of a plebiscite provided in Section 4 hereof shall be taken out of the annual budget of the city, corresponding to the year of its implementation and under the current fiscal year appropriations.

SECTION 10. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason, any provision, portion or part of this Ordinance is found to be inconsistent with any law, other provisions or part or parts thereof not so affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 11. REPEALING CLAUSE. - Any ordinance, rules and regulations, resolutions or part thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 12. EFFECTIVITY. - This Ordinance shall take immediately after complying with the necessary publication and posting requirements as mandated by law or the Local Government Code of 1991.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Given the facts and the analysis, the study group emphasizes that there is a growing governance gap in the district barangays of Ormoc City and this cannot be effectively addressed by short term solutions but will need structural/organizational change to fully address the root cause of the existing problem. The study group also manifests that based on the result of the study, it should be emphasized among the stakeholders that the purpose of the study is to look into the current situation and analyse the existing factors to be able to submit sound recommendation to city government of Ormoc highlighting the need to improve the services of the barangay governments to the Ormocanons through good local governments.

The study was able to highlight the various issues experienced by the district barangays in governance. Such as limited funds, lack of facilities and shortage in manpower. These issues were felt by the barangay officials and were validated by the people based on the survey conducted. The limited services provided by the barangay led to the request

Lastly, with the rapid development of Ormoc City and with its increasing capacity to accept businesses as an economic hub in the Eastern Visayas region. Towards the vision of Smart City, Ormoc City should start considering restructuring of these barangays sensitive to the Smart City Principle.

The study group recommends to:

- Develop a continuous monitoring mechanism among the district barangays to
 ensure availability of facilities and delivery of basic services to the constituents.
 The city may augment the capability of the barangays in terms of resources and
 technical capacity;
- Explore possible measures on addressing the barangay gaps brought about by too much bureaucracy in the district barangays vis-à-vis minimal number of constituents that led to too much personnel services expenditure which can be judiciously used for basic services;

- Commission an independent survey regarding community satisfaction on barangay governance and district barangays restructuring (Super Barangays Models).
- Explore the Smart Cities Initiatives indicators in "Super Barangays" model that
 will replace the old district structure. The "Super Barangay" model must be
 developed based on the existing parameters of SGLG-B, modern engineering,
 urban governance and Smart City indicators.
- Restructure the 28 district barangays into 3 barangays namely: Barangay East, Barangay West, Barangay South and rename Barangay District 29 to Barangay North through a local ordinance subject to the requirements of LGC and COMELEC for the plebiscite.
- Consider institutional change/reform through structural change in governance through Super Barangays Model packaged in comprehensive roadmap for transition while taking into consideration the various stakeholders that will be part of the district barangays restructuring program.

The merging of the different District Barangays will address concerns and issues pertaining to the capacity of the barangay to deliver the basic services to its constituents, comply with the minimum population requirements, provide for the allocation of funds for various projects for larger barangays vis-à-vis barangays with lesser area and population, address the concern as to the inadequate honoraria of barangays officials, as well as, resolve barangay boundary disputes.

The following are the possible positive effects of barangay merging:

- 1. It will address concerns and issues pertaining to barangay boundary disputes, seeming bias allocation of funds for various projects for larger barangays vis-à-vis barangays with lesser area and population as well as inadequate honorarium of barangay officials.
- 2. It will further enhance the development of the city and for their barangay being the smallest political subdivision of the Philippines will comply with the requirements enshrined in the Local Government Code of the Philippines. Conformity to the existing Laws.
- 3. District Barangays, admittedly, that there are District Barangays in Ormoc City that cannot actually comply with the minimum population requirement of 2,000 to allow

their existence as independent barangays of the city, thus incumbent barangay officials cannot actually claim the minimum honoraria allowed by law even if the said small barangays earn income and have a share of the Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) being provided by the national government. To sum, barangay merging will satisfy Barangay Officials as regards to salary.

- 4. It will clearly define the metes and bounds of the every district barangays to be merged.
- 5. Punong barangays will be entitled to receive an honoraria equivalent to Salary Grade 25 in the government compensation set up while sangguniang barangay members are also entitled to get an honoraria equivalent to Salary Grade 12.
- 6. The downsizing the Ormoc City's District Barangays from 29 to 4 Barangays will hew more to the provisions of law and this will allow the barangays to have the capacity to help the city government implement high-impact development projects and improve the delivery of basic services to their constituency.
- Recause of the inability of most of the City's barangays to achieve the minimum required population, most barangay officials do not enjoy the proper compensation for their round-the-clock duties that is why they make their barangay duties as part-time while focusing on their regular livelihoods. Ironically, most of the barangay officials in the lesser populated barangays in the city are tempted to be involved in corrupt activities that tend to compromise their credibility which is their last resort just to be able to provide the basic needs of their families. Some barangays compensate their Punong Barangay with a monthly honorarium of P2,700 monthly while their SBMs and other appointive officials get monthly honoraria of P1,500 or even less depending on the available Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) and the generated resources of the parangay. With the proposed Barangay Merging, they will be properly compensated.
- 8. It will guarantee efficient and effective service of barangay officials and employees, among others. With the merger of district barangays, public service will no longer be a part-time job but will allow dedicated public servants to sustain service to their constituents.

The problem hampers the flow of to the Barangay constituents;

The Sangguniang Paniungsod ng Ormoc, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the LGC 1991 otherwise known as the General Welfare Clause, deems it appropriate to uphold its legislative powers and accord preferential attention to the matter. It is the thrust of the city government to accelerate economic development and upgrade the quality of life of the people through proper control and administration. Hence, addressing the problem of Barangay District 6 is a priority task for the city

A thorough evaluation on the matter was made in coordination with various government offices directly involve on barangay matters. The study resulted to a consensus of creating merger between Barangay District 6 and Barangay District 5. The merging of the two barangays is subject to the provisions of Section 8, Division and Merger - of the LGC of 1991. It was believed that the merger will strengthen the affairs and economic activities of the place, thereby giving the residents therein opportunity and right to economic, social and political advancement.

Chapter 2, Section 6 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that "A Local Government Unit may be created, divided, merged, abolished, or its boundaries substantially altered either by law enacted by xxx xxx or by ordinance passed by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan or Sangguniang Panlungsod concerned in the case of a Barangay located within its territorial jurisdiction, subject to limitations requirements prescribed in this code".

ORDINANCE NO. 154

AN ORDINANCE MERGING BARANGAY DISTRICT 6 WITH BARANGAY DISTRICT 5, THIS CITY.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Eleventh Sangguniang Panlungsod ng Ormoc

SECTION I. <u>TITLE</u> - This Ordinance shall be known as "An Ordinance merging Barangay District 6 with Barangay District 5, this city."

SECTION 11. The merger of Barangay District 6 with Barangay to wit:

- Officials, as nobody has shown interest to run or file a Certificate of Candidacy during the 2007 Barangay Elections, and the delivery of basic public services to the constituents
- 2) Barangay District 6, in the 2007 NSO survey has a population of only 32 individuals, and a registered voters of 43 electors.

SECTION III. The territorial jurisdiction and entire population of Barangay District 6 will be integrated with Barangay District 5 following the marger.

SECTION IV SEAT OF GOVERNMENT - The seat of Government of the merged barangays will be at Barangay District 5 considering that it has a complete set of elected Barangay Officials and barangay facilities which are requisites for efficient and effective public governance. The incumbent set of barangay officials of District 5 will govern the entirety of the merged barangays until such time that a new set of officials will be elected in the next barangay elections.

SECTION V. This ordinance is subject to the results of a Plebiscite called for the purpose in the barangays affected which shall be conducted by the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) as provided for in Section 10 of the Local Government Code of 1991.

SECTION VI. $\underline{\text{EFFECTIVITY}}$. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after complying with the necessary publication and posting requirements as mandated by law.
