RESOLUTION NO. 32

Letter of Mr. Casiano Puray, Chief Sanitary Inspector  
for and in the absence of the City Health Officer, dated  
February 7, 1951 to the City Board thru the City Treasurer,  
Ormoc City and 1st Indorsement dated February 16, 1951,  
hereunder quoted verbatim as follows:

S i r s:

This is to inform the Hon. City Board, thru the City  
Treasurer, Ormoc City, that the field personnel of this  
department were unable to collect the reimbursement of  
traveling expenses and per diems, from September 1950 to  
the present, due to overdraft of this particular item.  
Their vouchers, therefore were held pending.

It is also further informed that biological products  
and other medical supplies are deposited in the office of  
PAL at Tacloban, from Manila, and could not be taken due  
to no appropriation of traveling expenses of personnel.

To remedy the situation, I respectfully request that  
the two unfilled positions as Sanitary Inspectors about  
two months saving amounted about ₱450.00, may be reverted  
for traveling expenses.

Any action taken to this request is earnestly enjoined.

It may be recalled that after the organization of primary classes in July, 1950, there existed in this city 19 excess primary positions due to lack of enrolment. According to standing policies of the BPS any excess position found in a district should be utilized in other districts of the division should the need arises on those districts in order to accomodate children of school age seeking admission. However, the undersigned who was then imbued and motivated with unselfish desire to serve the people of this city in matters of making our schools progressive made a bid for sacrifice by keeping the 19 excess primary positions in the district with the ulterior motive to make use of such positions in the event that there shall be an increase of enrolment in the primary grades next school year. In the meantime, the undersigned utilized such positions in the intermediate grades by employing more floating teachers of which the city coffer was not then ready to provide the corresponding funds without resulting in the elimination of an intermediate class or classes. The employment of more floating teachers was consistent with the adoption of the three-teacher-two class plan or the five-teacher-three class plan as authorized by the Secretary of Instruction (now Education) as per Circular No. 14, s. 1947. It will be noted in our intermediate budget for the fiscal year 1950-51 that from the 45 classes organized 10 floating teachers could only be employed although there should have been 30 floating teachers.

Unfortunately, an order from the Division Superintendent came stopping the practice followed by the City Supervisor in view of the provisions of Sec. 7 of Commonwealth Act 566 whereby the National Government was to assume the support of primary classes, and the cities (chartered) that of the intermediate classes. Since the teachers from the 19 excess primary positions were employed in the intermediate which funds came from the national government, it would therefore be irregular, if not illegal, to continue such practice. Hence, the laying off of the teachers so affected.

In view of the fact that the school year is about to end and the sudden elimination of such positions will result in the disruption of classes handled by the teachers concerned; and since the city was greatly benefited in the services rendered by these teachers, it is recommended, if funds are available, that the amount of P7,200 be appropriated from the general fund and transferred to the school fund in order to cover the salaries of 18 teachers for the period from March 9 to June 30, 1951 and in order that their services may be continued.
