RESOLUTION NO. 136

WHEREAS, the Municipal Board, Ormoc City was furnished a copy of the letter of Mr. Camilo Rosello addressed to the Supervising Principal of Ormoc II dated Sept. 1, 1952 advising said Supervising Principal to lay off Miss Pascualita Gonzales, Steno-Typist and Mr. Romulo Rosal, Office Clerk, Office of the Supervisor, Ormoc II for the reason that said items are not provided in the annual budget for the fiscal year 1952-1953;

WHEREAS, Councilor Alvaro I. Gutierrez informed the Hon. Board that said positions are so provided for in the present budget for the year 1952-1953 as approved by the Municipal Board of this City;

WHEREAS, Councilor Guillermo T. Parrilla suggested to correct the impression of the Office of the Division Supt. of Schools, Tacloban, Leyte to the effect that the positions of Miss Gonzales and Mr. Romulo Rosal of the Office of the City Supervisor of Ormoc Dist. II are not provided in the annual budget for the year 1952-1953, when as a matter of fact they are so provided in the present budget for the fiscal year 1952-1953 as approved by the Municipal Board;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board, on motion of Councilor Guillermo T. Parrilla, seconded by Councilor Esteban C. Conejos;

BE IT RESOLVED, as is hereby resolved, to correct the impression of the Office of the Division Superintendent of Schools, Tacloban, Leyte to the effect that the positions of Miss Pascualita Gonzales, Steno-Typist and Mr. Romulo Rosal, Office Clerk, Office of the Supervisor, Ormoc II are not provided in the annual budget for the year 1952-1953, when as a matter of fact said positions are so provided in the budget as approved by the Municipal Board;

RESOLVED FINALLY, to furnish copy of this resolution each to the Division Supt. of Schools, Tacloban, Leyte; City Mayor, Ormoc City; City Treasurer, Ormoc City; City Auditor, Ormoc City; Mr. Camilo Rosello, Ormoc City; Mr. Romulo Rosal and Miss Pascualita Gonzales, Ormoc City.

SECOND VETO OF RES. NO. 136, IN CONJUNCTION
TO RESOLUTION NO. 139, CURRENT SERIES
OF THE HONORABLE MUNICIPAL BOARD
OF ORMOC CITY, PURSUANT TO
REPUBLIC ACT NO. 179

By virtue of the powers vested in me by Art. 3, Sec. 14, of Republic Act No. 179, otherwise known as the Charter of Ormoc City, Res. No. 139, current series is hereby vetoed in conjunction to Res. No. 136, current series, vetoed on the 10th day of September, 1952, stating hereunder more specific reasons to wit:


1.- In accordance with the retrenchment policy initiated by the Honorable Municipal Board, Ormoc City, the Office of the Division Superintendent of Schools, economized by reducing the number of teaching positions from sixty-five (65) last school year to fifty-five (55) this school year, 1951-1952; and the number of clerical positions from fourteen (14) to six (6) this year, namely one chief clerk, one record clerk, one clerk-typist and three janitor-watchmen which are actually occupied by the respective incumbents. This economy was and is still guaranteed that all schools that have sufficient intermediate enrolment would be opened with improved methods of instruction. This guaranty has been fulfilled with the opening of all intermediate classes, central and barrios that have sufficient enrolment;

2.- With the fusion of the former two districts of Ormoc I and II into only one Office located in the Central Elementary School, Ormoc City, effective July 1, 1952, the aforementioned positions of clerk and janitors are certified to as the only office personnel essential and necessary in the efficient, honest and diligent performance of the office work of the public educational system of Ormoc City. The employment of Miss Pascualita Gonzales, Steno-Typist and Mr. Romulo Rosal, Office Clerk, which the school authorities deemed as non-essential and unnecessary will undoubtedly hamper the smooth functioning of the Office, aside from the fact that they merely duplicate the work of the aforecited clerks. Therefore, inconsistent to the retrenchment policy adverted to in the preceding first paragraph;

3.- Contrary to the 3rd paragraph of the Res. No. 139, the position of Steno-Typist and Office Clerk are not provided in Res. No. 143 and Ordinance No. 11 or the budget for the fiscal year 1951-1952. What is provided in the budget is a record clerk and a clerk-typist which are separate and distinct from the Steno-Typist and an Office Clerk, unless the Municipal Board desires to make a stretched interpretation that a clerk is equivalent to Steno-Typist, and that an Office Clerk is equivalent to Record Clerk. But if a correct interpretation should be made, the two sets of positions are separate and distinct because, a Steno-Typist receives a salary higher than an Office Clerk as shown in the budget submitted by the Municipal Board, and the record clerk receives more compensation than the clerk-typist.

In view of the foregoing the undersigned reiterates his veto on Res. No. 136, current series, in his veto on Res. No. 139 referring to the same subject-matter and the foregoing specific reasons aforestated.
