VETO OF RESOLUTION NO. 19 PASSED BY THE MONORABLE MUNICIPAL BOARD OF ORMOC CITY ON JANUARY 23, 1954, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF ART. 3, SECTION 14, REPUBLIC ACT NO. 179.

Resolution No. 19, passed by the Honorabia unicipal Board, Ormoc City, on January 23, 1954, is red, 1000 in accordance with the provisions of Section 14, Article III, Republic Act No. 179, for the following reasons.

The master philosophy of this resolution is predicted on the proposition that the policy force of or wor City now under PC Control be rearmed for the reasons therein stated.

Examining the theories advanced by the proponent of this resolution in order to be able to reach the root upon which these theories are mide to stand the examiner finds himself confront by the question. Is this a fair, just, and reasonable resolution for adoption? The answer is, NO.

Indeed, this resolution, if adopted, is unfair and unjust as it is unreasonable because it certainly hurts or indired, or askalls, the honesty, honor, integrity, valor might, and addity of the entire PC Command charged with the holistaty of maintaining peace and order in Ormoc City. This is allution, in spirit and substance, is an indirect elor stim of want of confidence in the PC as the real guardian of peace and order of this city. The PC is sufficient force to maintain such peace and order even without the existence of a police force.

The rearming of the police force placed under PC Control is not the best solution to the maintenance of peace and order in Ormoc City. A complete change of policy in relation to the reorganization of the entire police force compatible with the adopted stand of the present administration to give good, honest, and efficient government to the people is imperative. The present police force should first undergo rigid screening and as soon as the unfit, if any, are replaced by competent ones fit to be called "Policeman" that becomes the reasonable time to rearm them.

In view of the foregoing reasons, I vetoed this resolution.
