A RESOLUTION NO. 151

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE NATIONAL ECONOMIC COUNCIL,
MANILA, TO GIVE ORMOC CITY EQUIPMENTS WORTH \$1,000,000
FROM OUT OF THE EQUIPMENTS GIVEN BY JAFAN AS REPARATIONS TO THE PUTLIPPINES

"WHEREAS, during the TI World War in the Pacific, Ormoc City had been occupied by the Japanese Military Army using the two barracks of the Philippine Army and one barrack of the Philippine Constabulary as their training camp of the several thousands of Japanese soldiers;

"WHEREAS, before the II World War in the Pacific, Ormoc City, the then municipality of Ormoc, Leyte, was a first class municipality having the largest number of inhabitants among municipalities and her people including the government possess wealth enough to maintain their social, financial and political standing;

"WHEREAS, when the Japanese Military soldiers occupied Ormoc City the said soldiers caused untold damages and destruction to the wealth both personal and agricultural;

"WHEREAS, the City Government of Ormoc, the then municipality of Ormoc, Leyte, suffered great destruction to its buildings, schools, roads and bridges and other wealth through the treacherous occupation of the Japanese invaders;

"WHEREAS, when General MacArthur liberated the Philippines the most hardest site and commendable for soldiers' heroism was fought in Ormoc City and her bay which is known to everybody especially to the Americans and Japanese;

"WHEREAS, when the American soldiers landed and occupied Ormoc City the reactions of both army, Americans and Japanese, totally brought down the beautiful city of Ormoc, the then municipality of Ormoc, Leyte, into ashes losing all and everybody's wealth to the ground by the cause of fire;

"WHEREAS, of the aforementioned reasons, Ormoc City, the then municipality of Ormoc, Leyte, including property, both government and private were more than totally destroyed

when the capture of Ormoc City was used by the American Army as springboard for recapturing the Philippines and totally the whole Orient;

"WHEREAS, because of the great losses of Ormoc City during the aforementioned war we earnestly request the National Economic Council that Ormoc City be given a reparation in the amount of One Million Pesos (\$\mathbb{P}\$1,000,000) in the form of different equipments that could be used to ameliorate the city of Ormoc as soon as the Philippines receives reparations equipments from Japan;

"NOW, THEREFORE, the Board, on motion of Councilor Esteban C. Conejos, seconded by Councilor Jorge P. Tan, Jr.;

"BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to request as this Body hereby requests, the National Economic Council to give Ormoc City equipments worth the Million Pesos (\$1,000,000) from out of thereparations equipments given to the Philippines by Japan;

"RESOLVED FINALLY, to furnish copies of this Resolution each to the National Economic Council, Nanila; His Excellency, the President of the Philippines, Malacaiang, Manila; the Honorable City Layer, the City Auditor and the City Treasurer, all of Ormoc City.
"CARRIED UNANLAYOUSLY."
