RESOLUTION NO. 23

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 39, current series, of the City Council of Davao requests the President of the Philippines to suspend the implementation of Republic Act No. 1612, pending rendition of the opinion of the Secretary of Justice as requested by the Bureau of Internal Revenue and in the event that the opinion of the Secretary of Justice will be for the imposition of the taxation as interpreted by the Bureau of Internal Revenue, then to recommend to the Congress of the Philippines the amendment and/or outright repeal of this objectionable and grossly unfair provisions of the Mational Internal Revenue Code as amendment.

WHITEAS, this lody is in full consonance with the City Council of Davas in the blief that this direct taxation on agricultural products particularly on the hemp and copra will destroy the incentives of the planters to produce these peso-earning products and may even disrept the economy of this country considering the present low price of hemp and coppa already affected by various plants, diseases:

WHEREAS, the City of Ormoc is practically an agricultural city which, among its principal products are copra and hemp, and unless the 7% tax collectible from said products as opined by the Collector of Internal Revenue is totally removed, these two particular industries will eventually be killed and lead to chaos not only in this city but in the entire country;

"NOW, THEREFORE, the Board, on motion of Councilor Guillermo T. Parrilla, seconded by Councilor Teotimo P. Ocubillo;

"BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, that this Body in the interest and welfare of the people of Ormoc City and the people from other agricultural areas in the Philippines, concur in and adhere to the embodiments of Resolution No. 39, current series, of the City Council of Davao;

"BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER, that in the event the opinion of the Honorable Secretary of Justice will support the implementation of the taxation on copra and hemp as interpreted by the Bureau of Internal Revenue, to request as is hereby requested, both Houses of Congress, thru the President of the Philippines for the amendment and/or total repeal of this unfair provisions and objectionable features of Republic Act No. 1612;
