RESOLUTION NO. 194

"WHEREAS, in a special session held by this Board last May 30, 1956, Resolution No. 105 embodying Ordinance No. IX was passed and approved by the Board, an ordinance establishing and fixing the location of industrial zones within the City of Ormoc and requiring industrial establishments in the city to transfer their establishments to the industrial zone within the period of two years, with provision for penalty;

"WHEREAS, Executive Order No. IX of the Honorable City Mayor of Ormoc proclaimed the approval of the aforementioned ordinance on July 5, 1956 and set the date of its effectivity on July 5, 1958, a period of two years as prescribed in the same ordinance;

"WHEREAS, the owners of the industrial establishments affected by this ordinance have made representations with this Body requesting that the period of two years given them within which they should transfer their establishments to the prescribed industrial zone, be extended in order to give them an ample time to save enough money to finance the construction of a building to house their establishments and expenses incidental to their transfer to the industrial zone; and

"WHEREAS, transferring stationary engines and installations such as rice and corn mills from one section of the city to another, would involve not only hundreds but thousands of pesos, and considering that business these days is very slow, this body is inclined to consider favorably the request of the owners of the industrial establishments affected by the aforementioned ordinance;

"NOW, THEREFORE, the Board, on motion of Councilor Parrilla, seconded by Councilor Du;


"RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to extend the period of effectivity of Ordinance No. IX, series of 1956, to a period of four (4) years from July 5, 1958, the date of expiry of the original period of two years prescribed in said ordinance;

"RESOLVED FINALLY, to furnish copies of this resolution each to the Honorable City Mayor, the City Treasurer, the City Auditor, the City Engineer, the Municipal Judge, the City Attorney, the Chief of Police, the Fire Chief, the City Health Officer, and other parties concerned;


"CARRIED. Six affirmative votes, one abstention, no negative vote."
