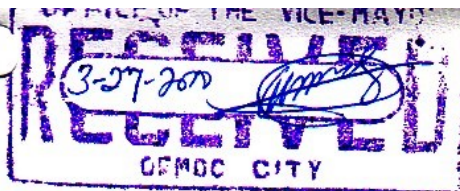

RESOLUTION NO. 2000-051

A RESOLUTION RESPECTFULLY ASKING CONGRESS NOT TO INCREASE TUITION FEES OF STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES IN THE PHILIPPINES.

WHEREAS, this august Body is in receipt of 1st Indorsement dated 14 March 2000 from the Honorable City Mayor Eufrocino M. Codilla, Sr., re: Letter of Mr. Gregorio T. de la Rosa, President, Leyte Institute of Technology, requesting for the passage of a resolution asking Congress not to increase tuition fees of state universities and colleges in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, said letter mentions of the consequences if any tuition fee increase is made of the said state universities and colleges, that is, it will defeat the purpose which is for the greater advantage of the poorer sector of our society, the deserving beneficiaries of state universities and colleges, thus making said students inefficient instead of moulding them to become efficient members of the labor force and globally competitive;

WHEREAS, in order to meet the needs of the universities, the amount which has been cut from the budget be restored;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod ng Ormoc has considered said request reasonable, hence, the same be accorded due course of action;

WHEREFORE, premises considered, on MASS MOTION of the Body; be it

RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to pass a resolution RESPECTFULLY ASKING CONGRESS NOT TO INCREASE TUITION FEES OF STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES IN THE PHILIPPINES;

ADOPTED, March 23, 2000.
