RESOLVTION REQUESTING THE HONORABLE ANDREW S. GONZALES. 13F THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, CULTURE AND (DECS) THROUGH MS. CIRILA V. VILLEGAS, DECS DIRECTOR, REGION VIII, TACLOBAN CITY AND DR. ALOCILJA, CITY DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT, DECS, ORMOC CITY DIVISION, FOR THE CREATION OF A NEW ORMOC CITY HIGH SCHOOL TO OPERATE THIS SCHOOL YEAR 2000-2001 WITH PROPORTIONATE FUNDING REQUIREMENTS FROM THE BUDGET OF THE ORMOC CITY SCHOOL OF ARTS AND TRADE AND FURTHER REQUEST DECS TO TRANSFER TO THE NEW ORMOG CITY HIGH THE REMAINING SIX (6) HECTARES WHICH IS IN EXCESS OF THE OPERATIONAL MEEDS OF THE ORMOC CITY SCHOOL OF ARTS AND TRADE.

WHEREAS, with the passage of Republic Act 8379, the Ormoc City National High School was converted into Ormoc City School of Arts and . Tradet

WHEREAS, with the conversion, not only thousands of students will be greatly affected but also parents and teachers as well, this opening of classes for school year 2000-2001 which situation was not foreseen or perhaps overlooked by the framer of the law converting Ormoc City National High School into a school of arts and trade;

WHEREAS, it has come to our knowledge that in the gradual implementation of Ormoc City School of Arts and Trade, the number of incoming first year students will be limited to one hundred twenty-five (125), thus, the existing facilities are more than enough to house the said gradual implementation;

WHEREAS, in a memorandum of agreement between the DECS and CHED, and noted by DBM, the Department of Education, Culture and Sports is mandated to cause the transfer of the assets, fixed and movable, and records of the Ormoc City National High School to the Ormoc City School of Arts and Trade as may be needed and reasonable according to the operational needs of the OCSAT;

WHEREAS, the existing facilities which will be left by DECS Ormoc City like land area, buildings, desks, equipments, Instructional Materials, and the fact that Ormoc City National High School has a Special Science classes, it has many facilities that may not be needed by OCSAT but can meet the necessary physical requirements for operating a new school;

WHEREAS, in the said Memorandum of Agreement the proportionate budget to be given to DECS may be enough to pay the salaries of teachers of the New Ormoc City High School which according to DECS Regional Director Cirila V. Villegas will help ease the burden of DECS and the local government in catering to the needs of incoming students and reaching out to many by providing access to quality education;

WHEREAS, under Section 7 of R α . 3655 DECS has been delegated the authority to establish schools;

WHEREAS, DECS Order No. 5, s. 1989 providing for the guidelines and procedures on the implementation of Section 7 of R.A. 6655 the establishment of school shall be under the following condition:

- 1. There is a real and urgent need in the area to be served for the type of secondary school proposed to be established which is clearly indicated in the project feasibility study conducted by the school district officials and favorably recommended by the Schools Division Superiotendent and the Regional Director. The feasibility study shall include, among others, the number of neighboring elementary schools which will serve as feeders, identification of nearby public and private high schools, and their respective enrolments;
- 2. A minimum enrolment of one hundred (100) students for the first curriculum year shall be sufficient, except in isolated barangay or igland municipality where a lesser number may be considered as justified by the Regional Director. Otherwise, the students shall be encouraged to enroll in the nearest high school.
- 3. A school site of at least one (1) hectare and initial classrooms duly documented as regards its ownership or use is available for the purpose.
- 4. Adequate funds for its initial operations for teachers salaries, allowances and benefits and other operating expenses including instructional costs (books), classroom materials and supplies, and administrative support services, are available from the region.

which conditions are met for the creation of a New Ormoc City High School.

WHEREAS, as stated above, with the existing physical facilities and the proportionate budget from OCSAT to be used in the creation of the New Ormoc City High School, this august Body finds no reason why DECS will not approve for opening of a New Ormoc City High School to operate this coming school year 2000-2001;
