

RESOLUTION NO. 2003-045

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HONORABLE CITY MAYOR CARMELO J. LOCSIN, TO LAUNCH THE ORMOC CITY LOCAL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AND TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH THE GRANTEE/GRANTEES, AND SELECTED STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES.

WHEREAS, this Sanggunian is in receipt of a letter dated 03 March 2003 from the Honorable City Mayor Carmelo J. Locsin, requesting for the passage of a resolution authorizing him to launch the Ormoc City Local Government Scholarship program and to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the scholars/grantees and selected State Universities and Colleges;

WHEREAS, said program is in accordance with the provision of the Philippine Constitution which provides that the state shall establish and maintain a system of scholarship grants, student loan programs, subsidies and other incentives which shall be available to deserving in both public and private schools especially to underprivileged; (Article XIV, Section 2, No. 3 Phil. Const.)

WHEREAS, this august Body believes that launching said program will provide educational assistance or study grants to the underprivileged but deserving students and to harness their potentials for the future development, thus helping attain national progress and prosperity;

WHEREFORE, foregoing premises considered, on motion of City Councilor Nepomuceno P. Aparis I, Chairman, Committee on Education, severally seconded by City Councilors Rafael C. Omega, Jr., Gregorio A. Yrastorza, Jr. and Cheryl L. Alfar; be it

RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to pass a resolution AUTHORIZING THE HONORABLE CITY MAYOR CARMELO J. LOCSIN, TO LAUNCH THE ORMOC CITY LOCAL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AND TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH THE GRANTEE/GRANTEES, AND SELECTED STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES;

ADOPTED, March 13, 2003.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement entered into by and between the City Government of Ormoc, represented by the City Mayor, hereinafter referred to as the City Government and ______ hereinafter referred to as the Grantee/Grantees;

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Article XIV, Section 2, No. 3 of the Philippine Constitution provides that the state shall establish and maintain a system of scholarship grants, students loan programs, subsidies and other incentives which shall be available to deserving students in both public and private schools especially to the underprivileged;

WHEREAS, consistent with the government policy to increase accessibility of education the masses, the City Government of Ormoc shall provide educational assistance or study grants to the underprivileged but deserving students in order to harness their potential for the future developmental needs and help in the attainment of national progress and prosperity.

NOW, THEREFORE, and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the parties to this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) do hereby covenant and agree to the following terms and conditions:

ARTICLE I - COVERAGE

This MOA shall be limited to qualified and deserving students especially to the under privileged. They will be enrolled in state universities and colleges (SUCS) located within or near the city concerned. The assistance or benefits granted shall be free tuition fees, lodging allowance, living subsidy and transportation allowance.

ARTICLE II - OBLIGATION OF THE GRANTEE

- The grantee must select his/her course preference;
- The grantee must carry a full semester load as prescribed in the approved course curriculum;
- 3. The grantee must finish his/her course within the prescribed course duration;
- 4. The grantee must maintain at least a grade of 2.5 in all subjects enrolled; any failing mark/grade will automatically disqualify the grantee of the scholarship program.
- 5. The grantee must not enjoy any scholarship or study grant at the time of the application;
- 6. Shifting of the course may be allowed after getting the approval from the registrar and the City Administration:
- 7. Transferring from one school to another and approval thereof by the registrar and the City Administration are allowed under justifiable reasons only during the first year of the scholarship study.
- 8. The registrar should approve dropping of subjects; any subject dropped shall be reimbursed by the grantee.
- 9. Incomplete grades should be completed during the semester or summer immediately after the school term where he/she obtained incomplete grades with expenses chargeable to the scholarship grantee.



ARTICLE III - OBLIGATION OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT

- 1. The City Government has the prerogative to select the deserving grantee/grantees;
- 2. The City Government should set qualification requirements and submission of the required documents by the applicants;
- 3. The City Government must see to it that the grantee/grantees finishes the course within the specified period and course requirement for graduation without stopping;
- 4. The City Government grants 100% of tuition fees and a percentage for book allowance, living subsidy, lodging allowance and transportation allowance;
- 5. The City Government will only issue the financial assistance upon notification from the school indicating the semester account of the grantee/grantees.

ARTICLE IV- TERMINATION OF MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA)

- 1. Falsification of Official records;
- Scholastic deficiency;

- 3. Transfer of school and shifting of course without the prior approval of the school registrar;
- 4. Membership/participation in any subversive organization;
- 5. Non-availability of funds.

ARTICLE V - BUDGET AND PAYMENTS

- 1. The City Government concerned shall incorporate in its respective budget programs the necessary funds to support the educational expenses of the grantee/grantees;
- 2. Upon approval of the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), the City Government through its City Treasurer shall release to the grantee/grantees the appropriate amount necessary for Sec. 5-A in accordance with the prescribed accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

ARTICLE VI - EFFECTIVITY

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) shall take effect beginning the school year 2003-2004.
