## RESOLUTION NO. 2017-239

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE DESIRE OF ORMOC CITY GOVERNMENT TO ESTABLISH A SISTERHOOD RELATIONSHIP WITH QUEZON CITY AND REQUESTING THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD AND CITY MAYOR OF QUEZON CITY TO ENTER INTO SISTERHOOD AGREEMENT WITH ORMOC CITY.

WHEREAS, Section 33, Article III, of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code mandates Local government units through appropriate ordinances to group themselves, consolidate or coordinate their efforts, services, or resources for purposes commonly beneficial to them and the terms and conditions for cooperative undertakings shall be contained in a Memorandum of Agreement;

WHEREAS, the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) supports sister-city arrangements and town-twinning partnerships and issued Memorandum Circular No. 97-306 dated November 25, 2007 providing guidelines in establishing national or international sister city and town twinning relationship to promote development initiatives that are mutually beneficial to the concerned government;

WHEREAS, it is a thrust of the current administration of Ormoc City government to reach out and foster friendship, partnership, joint ventures, understanding and cooperation with other local government units and even private entities to bring development and prosperity in Ormoc City;

WHEREAS, Ormoc City is the economic, cultural, commercial and transportation hub of Western Leyte and identified in the Provincial Development and Physical Framework Plan 2011-2016 as the (i) secondary center for manufacturing, commerce and trade, (ii) secondary center for education, (iii) gateway to Cebu City and other central islands, and (iv) destination for ecotourism;

WHEREAS, Quezon City Government envisions itself to be a model of effective governance and responsible leadership, working in partnership with the citizenry in building a quality community and a mission to provide quality service which will make Quezon City an ideal community where people live, work and do business in a hospitable, progressive and peaceful environment;

WHEREAS, Quezon City has received various awards for its best practices in the areas of disaster risk and reduction management, solid waste management, HIV/AIDS, Gender and development, anti-drugs campaign and good governance practices and these programs can very well serve as model programs for Ormoc City;

WHEREAS, through the establishment of sisterhood ties, Quezon City and Ormoc City, who are both growing and developing cities, will have an opportunity for an exchange of ideas, technology, skills and expertise to expand its connection in bringing about progress and advancement in their respective localities

WHEREAS, the establishment of sisterhood ties is mutually beneficial to Quezon City and Ormoc City especially in the attainment of their fullest development, improvement of public governance, and increase of self-reliance as local government unit.

WHEREAS, this Sanggunian, after thorough examination aforementioned request by the City Mayor finds that it is to the best interest of the City and its inhabitants, and advantageous to the same to request Quezon City to establish a sisterhood relationship with Ormoc City;

WHEREFORE, foregoing premises considered, on motion of SP Member Nolito M. Quilang, Chairman of the Committee on Cities Sisterhood Program, severally seconded by SP Members Mario M. Rodriguez, Tomas R. Serafica, Eusebio Gerardo S. Penserga, Gregorio G. Yrastorza III, John Eulalio Nepomuceno O. Aparis II, Lea Doris C. Villar, Mariano V. Corro and Rolando M. Villasencio; be it –
