WHEREAS, the 15th Sangguniang Panlungsod ng Ormoc received an endorsement letter from the Office of the City Mayor on October 30, 2019, requesting for an issuance of a Resolution granting the City Mayor, the authority to enter into and sign the Memorandum Of Agreement (MOA) to be entered into by and between the Local Government Unit Of Ormoc City (LGU-ORMOC) and the Department Of Public Works And Highways-Leyte 4th District Engineering Office (DPWH-LEYTE 4TH DEO) for the implementation of "Abaca Industry Rehabilitation Project: Regaining Profitable Fiber Production in Ormoc City, Brgys. Liberty, Gaas, Cabintan, Milagro and Tongonan, Ormoc City" in the amount of Twelve Million Three Hundred Twenty-Two Thousand Five Hundred Philippine Pesos (PHP 12,322,500.00), a copy of the final MOA is hereto attached as Annex "A" and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, the DPWH-LEYTE 4TH DEO, being the engineering and construction arm of the government, responsible for the planning, design and construction of infrastructure projects, is in receipt of a calamity funded program;

WHEREAS, the program entitled "Abaca Industry Rehabilitation Project: Regaining Profitable Fiber Production in Ormoc City, Brgys. Liberty, Gaas, Cabintan, Milagro and Tongonan, Ormoc City" has been included in the CY 2019 DPWH's Rehabilitation of Disaster-Related Infrastructure & Other Facilities Program to cover the implementation of calamity-related projects whose fund allocation has been approved by the Department of Budget and Management in the total amount of Twelve Million Three Hundred Twenty-Two Thousand Five Hundred Philippine Pesos (PHP 12,322,500.00) from Sub-Allotment No. SR2019-10-009691 dated October 04, 2019 under SARO No. BMB-A-19-0011607, a copy of the pertinent document is hereto attached as Annex "B" and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, the basic policy of the government is to ensure the expeditious delivery of basic services particularly to those areas affected by the magnitude 6.5 earthquake that shook the city;

WHEREAS, the DPWH-LEYTE 4TH DEO does not possess the required technical expertise and capability to effectively implement, manage and supervise the nature of the Abaca Industry Rehabilitation Project;

WHEREAS, the LGU-ORMOC thru its City Agriculture Office(CAO) is principally mandated to promote agricultural development in the city by providing technical assistance and services such as the rehabilitation of the abaca industry;

WHEREAS, the LGU-ORMOC has agreed to accept the program and commits to undertake its implementation thru the CAO from the procurement stage until its completion;

WHEREAS, after considering the recommendations of the City Legal Office, said office recommended that the MOA be endorsed to the Sangguniang Panlungsod to confer authority to the City Mayor to sign the same, a copy of the letter is hereto attached as Annex "C" and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, upon close and thorough review, this Sanggunian finds the aforementioned request by the City Mayor advantageous and for the best interest of the City considering the fact that Abaca is a vital crop of the country's economy as the Philippines is the largest producer of Abaca fibers;

Simbajon and Gregorio G. Yrastorza III; be it

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This **MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT** is entered into by and between:

THE **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS – LEYTE 4th DISTRICT ENGINEERING OFFICE**, a national government agency existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with office at Government Center, Brgy. Punta, Ormoc City, Leyte, represented herein by District Engineer **LINO FRANCISCO C. GONZALEZ**, duly authorized for the purpose and hereinafter referred to as "**DPWH-LEYTE 4TH DEO**"; and

The **LOCAL GOVERNMENT OF ORMOC CITY**, with office address, Brgy. Cogon, Ormoc City, a local government agency unit existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, represented by City Mayor **Hon. RICHARD I. GOMEZ**, hereinafter referred to as "**LGU/LGU CAO**".

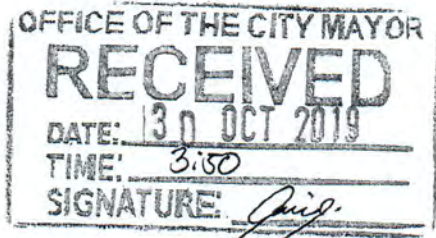
WHEREAS, it is the basic policy of the government to ensure the expeditious delivery of basic services particularly to those in the earthquake-affected areas;

Liberty, Gaas, Cabintan, Milagro, and Tungonan, Ormoc City**, hereinafter referred to as the "**PROJECT**", has been included in the CY 2019 DPWH's Rehabilitation of Disaster-Related Infrastructure & Other Facilities Program to cover the implementation of calamity-related projects whose fund allocation has been approved by the Department of Budget and Management in the total amount of **TWELVE MILLION THREE HUNDRED TWENTY TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (P12,322,500.00)** from **Sub-Allotment No. SR2019-10-009691** dated **October 04, 2019** under **SARO No. BMB-A-19-0011607**;

WHEREAS, the DPWH-LEYTE 4TH DEO does not possess the required technical expertise and capability to effectively implement, manage and supervise the nature of the project;

WHEREAS, the LGU City Agriculture Office is principally mandated to promote agricultural development in the city by providing technical and other forms of assistance including support to infrastructure development such as the rehabilitation of abaca industry project;

WHEREAS, the LGU-CAO has agreed to accept the Project and commits to undertake its implementation from the procurement stage until its completion;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises and of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereby agree on the following;

ARTICLE I GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. All Plans and Specifications as well as the Program shall be in accordance with the Philippines Agricultural Engineering Standards (PAES);
2. The parties represent that they have the requisite power, authority and capacity to enter into this Agreement and perform their obligations and responsibilities in accordance with the terms and conditions herein set forth;
3. The parties agree to sign, execute and deliver such lawful agreement and other documents that may be required during the implementation of the Project which shall be binding upon them and their respective successors-in-interest and assigns;
4. The parties may call for meeting or conferences at any stage of the Project in order to (a) thresh out existing or foreseeable problems that may cause a delay in the project implementation and (b) provide immediate remedial measures and solutions thereto;
5. An inspection team composed of representatives from both parties shall be organized to ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the approved plans and specifications and completed within the duration of the contract.

ARTICLE II RESPONSIBILITIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES

A. The DPWH-LEYTE 4TH DCO, being the Fund Source Agency, shall be responsible for the following:

1. Issue to the LGU-CAO a transfer of funds through Obligation Request (OBR) equivalent to the approved project cost based on the allotment authorized by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM). The OBR shall serve as the obligational authority of the LGU-CAO to implement the Project.

2. Transfer of fund to LGU-CAO of the total allocation for the project is in three (3) releases as follows:

2.1 First Release = **50%** of the total fund allocation upon signing and approval of the Memorandum (MOA) and submission of other supporting documents required as mobilization fund.

2.2 Second Release = **40%** of the total fund allocation upon submission of Statement of Work Accomplishment of not less than 50%, validated by the designated Local Government Unit (LGU)

2. Undertake the procurement process in accordance with RA 9184, also known as the "The Government Procurement Reform Act" and its Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations;
3. Complete the Project in accordance with the approved plans, specifications and program of works and within the contract duration;
4. Submit to the DPWH-LEYTE 4TH DEO the required physical and financial status reports on a periodic basis or as may be required by the said agency;
5. Upon completion and turn-over of the Project, shall refund any unutilized amount to the DPWH-LEYTE 4TH DEO, together with the Liquidation Report as received and audited by the resident COA Auditor and accompanied by geo-tagged pictures (before, during and completed) signed by the Project Engineer.

PROJECT PROPOSAL

I. PROJECT TITLE: ABACA INDUSTRY REHABILITATION: REGAINING PROFITABLE FIBER PRODUCTION IN ORMOC CITY

II. Description

a. Brief summary of the Project:

The project will be a collaborative work with LGU of Ormoc, EDC, PhilFIDA, and NARC. This primarily calls for the total eradication of abaca plantations in five (5) known barangays of Ormoc City, namely; 1) Liberty, 2) Gaas, 3) Milagro, 4) Cabintan and 5) Tongonan. The eradication work will provide "cash for work" program through strictly employment of manual roughing over existing abaca plants thereby creating livelihood to local farmers. Chemical treatments is also encourage to control and manage the vector and totally kill diseased infected abaca preventing to proliferate again. Training for production such as proper planting distance, appropriate fertilizer application, disease management and other cultural management practices will be offered.

b. Rationale

Abaca (*Musa textilis* Nee), is indigenous to the Philippines and its fiber is known worldwide as Manila hemp. The fiber is obtained from the leaf sheaths of the abaca plant which is similar to banana in appearance. Abaca fiber is considered the strongest among natural fibers and is used as raw material for cordage, fiber crafts and pulp for the production of specialty paper products used in Philippines currency. Leyte used to be in the third top producing abaca province, but now it slipped to 14th. This is primarily due to viral diseases outbreak particularly, bunchy-top and mosaic virus. Because of massive infestation, the region's output dropped to 8,418 metric tons in 2015 from 29,444 metric tons in 2003. Moreover, just before Yolanda devastated the region, out of 917.16 ha devoted for abaca production in Ormoc City, only 333.97 ha were still active while 583.17 ha were abandoned (2013 data) mainly due to ABTV. Thus, there is a need to rehabilitate the production of abaca through total eradication and growing only tissue

cultured seedlings which have tolerance or resistance to these virus diseases.

The provision of these seedlings is not free and farmers are obliged to pay by giving high quality abaca seedlings out of his vigorously growing abaca to the adjacent community within the city. They will give the same quantity from what they receive to other abaca-farmer recipients. Planting costs will be the farmers' counterpart.

c. Project Goals and Objectives:

General: Regain and intensify abaca production in Ormoc and subsequently increase income of abaca farmers

Specific:

- i. Eradicate existing abaca plants that wether previously infested or not with ABTV;
- ii. Provide the necessary training/capability-building intervention to enhance the skills of farmers towards sustainable abaca fiber production;
- iii. Increase the income of abaca farmers

d. Location: Barangays Liberty, Gaas, Milagro, Cabintan, Tongonan, Ormoc City

e. Type and Estimated Number of Target Beneficiaries:

As first batch, ten (10) farmers each of five (5) barangays known to have preiously growing abaca (total of 50 farmers). About 10 hectares per barangay will be planted (total of 50 hectares). Each hectare on the other hand will hire 20 workforce personnel to do the eradication procedures manually for 22 days (1 month).

VIII. Project Methodology:

Site and farmer cooperators selection

The location of existing abaca plantation to be eradicated shall be considered based on topographic and edaphic suitability. Experts from PhilFIDA shall be tapped to facilitate site evaluation. Coordination with Energy Development Corporation (EDC) personnel shall be done as these six barangays are belongs to their protected zone of responsibility.

Farmer cooperators on the other hand shall be evaluated and selected by the City Agriculture Office (CAO) of ormoc.

Capability building

Training on abaca production and fiber extraction will be held by NARC experts immediately after site evaluation and selection of farmers. Pest management of abaca shall be taught also as this is the main concern towards succesful abaca production.

Total eradication of existing abaca plantation

Manual roughing and burning of all exesting abaca plants in the selected sites will be done. The use of chemical spray or injection is encourage for complete eridication of the virus.

Purchase of tissue cultured abaca seedlings

Tissue cultured abaca seedlings from Visayas State University will be procured and use as planting materials.

Transplanting of abaca

Planting operation shall be employed based on training they will have. Recommended planting distance of 3m x 3m shall be followed.

Field monitoring

Regular visits (twice a month) will be done to the collaborating abaca fields to monitor the stands of every plantation field.

VIII. Project Risk Management and Sustainability

The project will be implemented in accordance to the Republic Act 1176 also known as an act authorizing the zonification of abaca areas, actual and potential, and prescribing certain planting restrictions and other measures for the control of abaca mosaic disease to protect the abaca industry.

Another batch of abaca farmers will be a recipient of abaca seedlings out of the vigorously growing abaca plants from the first batch. This will assess the sustainability of the project.
