WHEREAS, the Fifteenth Sangguniang Panlungsod ng Ormoc received copies of Ordinances from the above enumerated Barangays, all entitled: "Barangay Ecological Solid Waste Management Ordinance". The copies of the Ordinances together with its attachments are hereto attached and made an integral part hereof";

WHEREAS, the ordinances were submitted to this Sanggunian pursuant to its review powers over enacted ordinances of all barangays within its territory as provided for in Section 57 and 458 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991" (LGC) in order to find out whether the subject Ordinances approved by the respective Sangguniang Barangays are within the scope of its prescribed powers and also whether the same are in conformity with law and city ordinances;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code (RA 7160) provides: "General Welfare. Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things . . . promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants";

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Republic Act No. 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000, under its Declaration of Policy provides that "the policy of the state is to adopt a systematic, comprehensive and ecological solid waste management program which shall ensure the proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment and disposal of garbage, and adoption of the best environmental practices in solid waste management";

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Republic Act No. 9003, under its Solid Waste Management System provides for the role of the Local Government Unit (LGU) in Solid Waste Management, which states that, "the Local Government Unit (LGU) shall be primarily responsible for the effective implementation and enforcement of the provisions of Republic Act No. 9003 within their respective jurisdictions";

WHEREAS, the unsystematic waste disposal by households and commercial or industry establishments cause unsightly surroundings and high possibility of spread of communicable diseases;

WHEREAS, the practice of waste segregation to facilitate reuse and recycle does not only reduce the cost of collection and disposal of garbage but conserves the natural resources of materials and avoid wasteful consumption of goods;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod and Ormoc City as a whole, is committed to the protection, preservation and conservation of the ecosystem, and recognizes the need to have an effective, efficient and systematic Solid Waste Management System;

WHEREAS, Section 4, Rule XIX of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 9003 provides that local government units shall be required to legislate appropriate ordinances to aid in the implementation of Republic Act No. 9003 and in the enforcement of its provisions; provided, such ordinances shall be formulated pursuant to relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160;

WHEREAS, this Sanggunian, finally finds that the Ordinances are valid and lawful and within the scope and authority of the Barangays, and therefore, manifests herein no objections to its implementation, and even urges that they be implemented immediately in order to speedily further the noble ends they seek for welfare of the Barangays;

PREFARATORY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code (RA 7160) provides: General Welfare. Every local government unit shall exercise the power expressly granted, those necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support and support, among other things, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants";

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Republic Act 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000, declares "the policy of the state is to adopt a systematic, comprehensive and ecological solid waste management program which small ensure the proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment and disposal of parbage and adoption of the best environmental practices in solid waste management";

WHEREAS, RA 9003 under its Solid Waste Management System provides the role of the Barangay in Solid Waste Management, as responsible for the segregation at source, responsible for segregated collection, the Biodegradable, Non-piodegradable and compostable waste and responsible for the set-up of Material Recovery Facility (MRF);

WHEREAS, the practice of segregation, to facilitate reuse and recycle does not only reduce the cost of collection and disposal of garbage but conserves the natural resources of materials and avoid consumption of goods:

WHEREAS, Sangguniang barangay of Brgy. ALTA VISTA, Ormoc City as a whole, is committed to the protection, preservation and conservation of the ecosystem, and recognizes the need to have an effective, efficient and systematic Solid Waste Management System;

WHEREAS, in the RA 9003 provides that barangays are required to legislate appropriate ordinances to aid in the implementation of RA 9003 and in the enforcement of its provisions, pursuant to relevant provisions of RA 7160:

WHEREFORE, all foregoing premises considered, on motion of SB Member Jose Allan A. Rosal and unanimously seconded by All Sangguniang Barangay Members present in session; be it

RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to enact:

ORDINANCE NO. 9 2019

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CITY ORDINANCE NO. 36 S. 2017 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "ORMOC CITY ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT OF 2017."

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Sangguniang Barangay of ALTA VISTA, Ormoc City in session duly assembled that:

ARTICLE GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the" Brgy. ALTA VISTA Ecological Solid Waste

SECTION 2. SCOPE. This Ordinance shall apply to all residential houses; all sari-sari stores and commercial entities, schools, chapels, public and private entities and agricultural areas situated within the territorial jurisdiction of Brgy. ALTA VISTA, Ormoc City.

SECTION 3. BASIC CONCEPT. Any waste generated in this barangay should be the responsibility by the household concerned and all commercial and agricultural both private and public entities and agricultural areas situated within territorial jurisdiction of Brgy. ALTA VISTA, Ormoc City.

SECTION 4. PURPOSE. This Ordinance is enacted for the following purposes:

4.1 To control and regulate the generation of solid wastes within the barangay and promote good sanitation practice:

4.2 To promote and protect the health, safety and convenience of the general welfare of the inhabitants of this barangay;

4.3 To minimize the generation of wastes and introduce the recycling, re-using, recover and composting of waste in this barangay;

SECTION 5. DECLARATION OF POLICIES. It is hereby declared the policy of Brgy. ALTA VISTA to adopt and implement a comprehensive, integrated and ecological solid waste management program which shall:

5.1 Ensure the protection of public health and the environment for the safety, convenience and general welfare of inhabitants of this barangay;

5.2 Set guidelines for the generation, segregation and disposal of solid waste in accordance with ecologically sustainable development principles;

5.3 Strengthen the Barangay Solid Waste Management organizations/committees at various levels;

5.4 Activate Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Campaign on Solid Waste Management on different households in order to promote environmental awareness and action among the inhabitants in this barangay;

5.5 Implement enforcement plan in the different households in this barangay.

5.6 Promote and institutionalize greater public participation in the program of Solid Waste Management;

SECTION 6. OBJECTIVES: The Objectives of this Ordinance are the following:

6.1 To ensure proper segregation of waste through proper management of wastes;

6.2 To utilize agricultural wastes by recycling this waste through composting; and

6.3 To ensure good sanitation practice in this barangay.

ARTICLE II ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FUNCTIONS

SECTION 7. CREATION OF BRGY. ALTA VISTA ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (RESWMC). The Brgy. ALTA VISTA Ecological Solid Waste Management Committee (BESWMC) shall be composed of the following:

The Punong Barangay as Chairman;

b. The Chairman of the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources as Vice Chairman;

c. SK Chairperson

d. Homeowners Association President

e. Public or Private School Principal or representative

f. Public School (PTA) president or representative

g. Religious organizations representative

h. Business community president or representative

i. NGO Representative (concerned about environment)

j. President of the Market Vendors Association and junkyard owners, if any

SECTION 8. FUNCTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF BRGY. ALTA VISTA ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (BESWMC)

8.1 Develop or revise the Brgy. ALTA VISTA Ecological Solid Waste Management Plan (BESWMP) which shall ensure the long-term management of solid waste, as well As integrate the various solid waste management plans and strategies of the City of Ormoc;

8.2 Review documents, monitor and evaluate current practices, programs and policies of the barangay.

8.3 Formulate enabling ordinances to implement the program;

8.4 Develop/produce/reproduce and disseminate Solid Waste Management promotional material:

- 8.5 Conduct Information/ advocacy campaign to different households and other waste generators;
- 8.6 Organize and train Barangay Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Committees;
- 8.7 To enter in to partnership with public or private educational institutions in their IEC campaign to different households and waste generators;
- 8.8 Appoint an MRF-in-charge for all Barangay MRFs.
- 8.9 Perform such other functions as may be required;

ARTICLE III WASTE GENERATION AND STORAGE

SECTION 9. WASTE CLASSIFICATION. All solid waste generated shall be classified into five (5) Major Groups, as follows:

- a. Biodegradable or Compostable Waste- can be defined as a material which can be decomposed by bacteria or other natural organisms and not be adding to pollution including, but not limited to: fruit & vegetable peelings, spoiled food & leftovers, vegetable trimmings, fish scales, egg shells, seafood shells, animal entrails & carcasses, corn cobs & sheaths, rice hulls, peanut shells, wet newspapers & cardboards, wet papers and cartons, coconut shells & husks, seeds, garden & grass clippings, pet/poultry/livestock manure, chipped branches
- b. Non-Biodegradable Waste- wastes that cannot be decomposed rapidly by the action of microorganisms or cannot be broken down into natural components, and will exist in the environment for a long time. It includes, but not limited to: cans; metals; plastics; glass bottles;
- c. Reusable or Recyclable Waste- waste that can be used again or can be easily converted into something useful. It includes, but not limited to: dry papers and newspapers, dry cardboards, & cartons, plastic materials like plastic containers, plastic water bottles, plastic bottles caps, PVC & PE pipes, computer casing, tin cans, & covers, aluminum cans, iron steel, copper wires, broken transparent glasses, glass bottles, toner cartridges, computer ink
- d. Hazardous or Special Waste shall refer to household hazardous waste such as paints, thinners, household batteries, lead acid, batteries, spray canisters and the like. These include waste from residential and commercial sources that comprise of bulky waste, consumers electronics, white goods, vard waste that are collected separately, batteries oil and tires. These waste are usually handles separately from other residential and commercial wastes;
- e. Bulky Waste- wastes that are bulky in size or shape. It includes but not limited to: used rubber tires, garden debris, destroyed TV sets, radios, stereos, washing machines, dryers, stoves, refrigerators, & dishwashers; broken furniture, filing cabinets, book cases, beds & cushions.

SECTION 10. MANDATORY SEGREGATION OF SOLID WASTE. The segregation shall be mandatory, and shall be primarily conducted by the generators at the source, to include households, institutional, industrial, commercial and agricultural sources based on waste classification provided under Section 9. No segregation-

SECTION 11. REQUIREMENT FOR WASTE SEGREGATION. Households and establishments must have suitable containers or receptacles (i.e sacks, bins, boxes, cans, bags, etc.) for each type of solid waste inside their household or premises. Wastes shall be stored only within the premises of the generator or at the assigned areas pending collection. Separate containers should be properly labeled, marked or identified for on-site collection as follows: MALATA/BIODEGRADABLE, DI-MALATA/NON-BIODEGRADABLE, DI-MALATA NGA MAGAMIT PA/REUSABLE/RECYCLABLE, and SPECIAL WASTE.

SECTION 12. HIERARCHY OF SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT. All households and waste generators must observe the following Solid Waste Management practices (according to its order of priority):

- a) Source Reduction- reduce waste by using products with less packaging and with reusable
- b) Re-Use- reduce waste by reusing materials like plastic bags, paper, glass, metals and other reusable waste materials;
- c) Recycle- reduce waste by selling and transforming recyclable waste into materials that can be a means of livelihood to the household of this barangay;
- d) Composting- reduce waste by converting food left-overs, kitchen wastes, fruit peelings, dried leaves, vegetable peelings and the like into compost; and
- e) Disposal must be the last option. Waste that cannot be reused, recycled or composted must be segregated and disposed properly.

SECTION 13. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PREMISES CONTAINING SIX (6) OR MORE RESIDENTIAL UNITS. The owner or person in charge of premises containing six (6) or more residential units shall provide for the residents a designated area and containers in which to accumulate source separated recyclable materials for collection. In addition, such owner or person in charge shall notify or inform the residents or occupants of such premises of the requirements of segregation.

SECTION 14. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS IN AGRICULTURAL AREAS. Agricultural waste such as rice straws, corn cobs, leaves, animal manure, etc., shall be properly stockpiled by the concerned individual for composting. Burning of agricultural waste shall be prohibited.

ARTICLE III COLLECTION AND TRANSPORT

SECTION 15. WASTE COLLECTION SYSTEM AND DROP-OFF POINTS. All households or generators must have a designated strategic collection or drop-off points to facilitate hauling of segregated waste materials.

ARTICLE IV WASTE PROCESSING AND RESOURCE RECOVERY

SECTION 16. ESTABLISHMENT OF BARANGAY MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY (BMRF). A minimum size of One Meter by Three Meters (1mx3m) must be established in every Purok or Sitio.

SECTION 17. BACKYARD COMPOSTING. Aside from the Barangay Material Recovery Facility (BMRF) all household must establish a space to do backyard composting by establishing compost heaps and bins. All households are required to actively participate the Barangay Program "UTANON KADA BALAY PROGRAM."

ARTICLE V SPECIAL PROVISION

SECTION 18. ISSUANCE OF ECOLOGICAL SOLID WAS TE MANAGEMENT CLEARANCE. All sari-sari store, commercial, institutional establishments and agricultural businesses shall secure and Ecological Solid Waste Management Clearance/ Certificate. Which will be issued by the Barangay Treasurer of Brgy. ALTA VISTA. Ormoc City. The Ecological Solid Waste Mariagement Clearance/ Certificate will serve as a proof that the owner/ manager has undergone orientation on Ecological Solid Waste Management conducted by barangay and the

ARTICLE VI PENAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 19. PROHISITED ACTS AND PENALTIES. The following acts are prohibited under this Ordinance

19.1. Indiscriminately Dumping of Carbage, Littering, Throwing, Dumping of solid Waste Matters in Public Places such as Roads, Sidewalks, Canals, Drainage Systems, Curbs and Gutters, Creeks, Rivers, Tributaries, Rivulets and other Natural Waterways, or causing or permitting the same;

Second offense - PhP 400.00 Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 800.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Brgy. ALTA VISTA, Ormoc City.

19.2. Open Burning of Solid Wastes Including Tires and Plastics in any forms;

- PhP 200.00 Second offense - PhP 400.00 Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 800.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Brgy. ALTA VISTA, Ormoc City.

19.3. Open dumping, burying of Biodegradable or non-biodegradable materials in flood-prone areas; First offense

Second offense - PhP 500.00 Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 1,000.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Brgy. ALTA VISTA, Ormoc City.

19.4. Non-Segregation or Unsorting of Waste.

First offense - Ph 300.00 Second offense - PhP 500.00 Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 1,000.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Brgy. ALTA VISTA, Ormoc City.

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19.5. Unauthorized removal of recyclable material intended for collection by authorized persons. First offense - PhP 300.00

Second offense - PhP 500 00

Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 1.000 00
