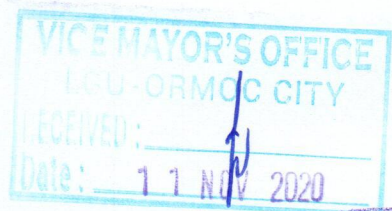
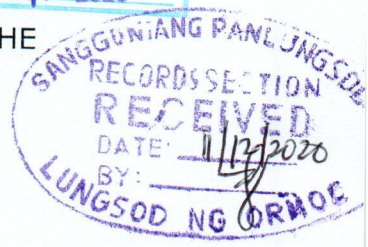

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-367

**A RESOLUTION DECLARING THAT THE BARANGAY
ORDINANCE NO. 01 S. 2020 OF BARANGAY DISTRICT
6, ENTITLED: "BRGY. DISTRICT 6 ECOLOGICAL SOLID
WASTE MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE" UNDER REVIEW
HAS BEEN FOUND TO BE IN CONFORMITY WITH
EXISTING LAWS AND ORDINANCES, AND
INTERPOSING NO OBJECTION TO ITS
IMPLEMENTATION.**

WHEREAS, the Fifteenth Sangguniang Panlungsod ng Ormoc received a copy of Ordinance from the above-mentioned Barangay, entitled: "Barangay District 6 Ecological Solid Waste Management Ordinance". The copy of the Ordinance together with its attachments is hereto attached and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, the ordinance was submitted to this Sanggunian pursuant to its review powers over enacted ordinances of all barangays within its territory as provided for in Section 57 and 458 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991" (LGC) in order to find out whether the subject Ordinances approved by the respective Sangguniang Barangays are within the scope of its prescribed powers and also whether the same are in conformity with law and city ordinances;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code (RA 7160) provides: "General Welfare. Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things . . . promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants";

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Republic Act No. 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000, under its Declaration of Policy provides that "the policy of the state is to adopt a systematic, comprehensive and ecological solid waste management program which shall ensure the proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment and disposal of garbage, and adoption of the best environmental practices in solid waste management";

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Republic Act No. 9003, under its Solid Waste Management System provides for the role of the Local Government Unit (LGU) in Solid Waste Management, which states that, "the Local Government Unit (LGU) shall be primarily responsible for the effective implementation and enforcement of the provisions of Republic Act No. 9003 within their respective jurisdictions";

WHEREAS, the unsystematic waste disposal by households and commercial or industry establishments cause unsightly surroundings and high possibility of spread of communicable diseases;

WHEREAS, the practice of waste segregation to facilitate reuse and recycle does not only reduce the cost of collection and disposal of garbage but conserves the natural resources of materials and avoid wasteful consumption of goods;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod and Ormoc City as a whole, is committed to the protection, preservation and conservation of the ecosystem, and recognizes the need to have an effective, efficient and systematic Solid Waste Management System;

WHEREAS, Section 4, Rule XIX of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 9003 provides that local government units shall be required to legislate appropriate ordinances to aid in the implementation of Republic Act No. 9003 and in the enforcement of its provisions; provided, such ordinances shall be formulated pursuant to relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160;

WHEREAS, this Sanggunian, finally finds that the Ordinance is valid and lawful and within the scope and authority of the Barangay, and therefore, manifests herein no objections to its implementation, and even urges that they be implemented immediately in order to speedily further the noble ends they seek for welfare of the Barangays;

WHEREFORE, on joint motion of SP Member Lalaine A. Marcos, Chairman, Committee on Environment, Natural Resources and Energy Conservation and SP Member Benjamin S. Pongos, Jr., Chairman, Committee on Laws and Ordinances, severally seconded by SP Members Tomas R. Serafica, Esteban V. Laurente, Peter M. Rodriguez, Gregorio G. Yrastorza III and Joan Marbie C. Simbajon; be it

RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to pass a RESOLUTION DECLARING THAT THE BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO. 01 S. 2020 OF BARANGAY DISTRICT 6, ENTITLED: "BRGY. DISTRICT 6 ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE" UNDER REVIEW HAS BEEN FOUND TO BE IN CONFORMITY WITH EXISTING LAWS AND ORDINANCES, AND INTERPOSING NO OBJECTION TO ITS IMPLEMENTATION;

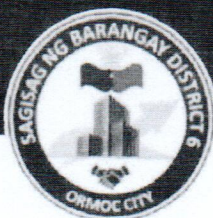

Barangay Ordinance No. 01, Series of 2020

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CITY ORDINANCE NO. 36 S. 2017 ADOPTING ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM, CREATING THE NECESSARY INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISMS, APPROPRIATING FUNDS AND REWARDS, DECLARING CERTAIN ACTS PROHIBITED AND PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREOF.

PREFATORY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code (RA 7160) provides that every local government unit shall exercise the power expressly granted, those necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things...promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants;

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Republic Act 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000, under its Declaration of Policy provides that the policy of the state is to adopt a systematic, comprehensive and ecological solid waste management program which shall ensure the proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment and disposal of garbage and adoption of the best environmental practices in solid waste management;

WHEREAS, RA 9003 under its Solid Waste Management System provides the role of the Barangay in Solid Waste Management, which states that the Barangay is responsible for the segregation at source, responsible for segregated collection, the biodegradable, non-biodegradable and compostable waste and responsible for the set-up of Material Recovery Facility (MRF);

WHEREAS, the practice of segregation to facilitate reuse and recycle does not only reduce the cost of collection and disposal of garbage but conserves the natural resources of materials and avoid consumption of goods;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City as a whole, is committed to the protection, preservation and conservation of the ecosystem, and recognizes the need to have an effective, efficient and systematic Solid Waste Management System;

WHEREAS, Section 4, Rule XIX of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 9003 provides that local government units shall be required to legislate appropriate ordinances to aid in the implementation of Republic Act No. 9003 and in the enforcement of its provisions; provided, such ordinances shall be formulated pursuant to relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160;

WHEREFORE, all foregoing premises considered, on motion of SB Member Gabriel Joshua C. LAPA and unanimously seconded by all Sangguniang Barangay Members present;

BE IT ORDAINED in Regular Session assembled that:

ARTICLE I GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Barangay District 6 Ecological Solid Waste Management Ordinance of 2020".

SECTION 2. SCOPE. This Ordinance shall apply to all residential houses; all sari-sari stores and commercial entities, schools, chapels, and public and private entities situated within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City.

SECTION 3. BASIC CONCEPT. Any waste generated in this barangay should be the responsibility by the household concerned and all commercial entities, both private and public, situated within territorial jurisdiction of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City.

SECTION 4. PURPOSE. This Ordinance is enacted for the following purposes:

- a) To control and regulate the generation of solid wastes within the barangay and promote good sanitation practice;
- b) To promote and protect the health, safety and convenience of the general welfare of the inhabitants of this barangay;
- c) To minimize the generation of wastes and introduce the recycling, re-using, recover and composting of waste in this barangay;

SECTION 5. DECLARATION OF POLICIES. It is hereby declared the policy of the Barangay to adopt and implement a comprehensive, integrated and ecological solid waste management program which shall:

- a) Ensure the protection of public health and the environment for the safety, convenience and general welfare of inhabitants of this barangay;
- b) Set guidelines for the generation, segregation and disposal of solid waste in accordance with ecologically sustainable development principles;
- c) Strengthen the Barangay Solid Waste Management organizations/committees at various levels;
- d) Activate Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Campaign on Solid Waste Management on different households in order to promote environmental awareness and action among the inhabitants in this barangay;
- e) Implement enforcement plan in the different households in this barangay.
- f) Promote and institutionalize greater public and private sector participation in the program of Solid Waste Management;

SECTION 6. OBJECTIVES: The Objectives of this Ordinance are the following:

- a) To ensure proper segregation of waste through proper management of wastes; and
- b) To ensure good sanitation practice in this barangay by eradicating unsightly, uncovered, and overflowing waste containers in streets, public places, and open spaces.

ARTICLE II ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FUNCTIONS

SECTION 7. CREATION OF BARANGAY DISTRICT 6 ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (BESWMC). The Barangay District 6 Ecological Solid Waste Management Committee (BESWMC) shall be composed of the following:

SECTION 8. FUNCTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF BARANAGY DISTRICT 6 ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (BESWMC)

- a) Develop, formulate, and revise the Barangay Ecological Solid Waste Management Plan (BESWMP) that shall ensure the long-term management of solid waste, as well as integrate the various solid waste management plan and strategies of the City of Ormoc;
- b) Review documents, monitor, and evaluate current practices, programs, and policies of the barangay on solid waste management;
- c) Formulate enabling ordinances to implement effectively the solid waste management program;
- d) Develop/produce/reproduce and disseminate solid waste management promotional material;
- e) Conduct information/advocacy campaign to different households and other waste generators on ecological solid waste segregation, composting, reduction of waste for disposal, and recycling;
- f) Set-up of Materials Recovery Facility with the barangay for non-biodegradable or recyclable materials;
- g) Establish a system of buying and selling of recyclable wastes including compost; and
- h) Perform such other functions as may be required.

ARTICLE III WASTE GENERATION, STORAGE, AND COLLECTION

SECTION 9. WASTE CLASSIFICATION. All solid waste generated shall be classified into five (5) Major Groups, as follows:

- a) **Biodegradable or Compostable Waste**
 - Shall refer to any material that can be reduced into particles, degraded or decomposed by microbiological or enzymes. This is synonymous with compostable.
- b) **Non-Biodegradable Waste**
 - Shall refer to waste that cannot be decomposed rapidly by the action of microorganisms or cannot be broken down into natural components, and will exist in the environment for a long time.
- c) **Reusable or Recyclable Waste**
 - Shall refer to any waste material retrieved from the waste stream and free from contamination that can still be converted into suitable beneficial use or for other purposes
- d) **Hazardous or Special Waste; and**
 - Hazardous waste shall refer to solid waste management or combination of solid waste which because of its quantity, concentration or physical, chemical or infectious characteristics may: (1) cause, or significantly contribute to an increase in mortality or an increase in serious irreversible, or incapacitating reversible, illness; or (2) pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported, or disposed of, or otherwise managed.
 - Special waste shall refer to household hazardous wastes such as paints, thinners, household batteries, lead-acid batteries, spray canisters and the like. These

include wastes from residential and commercial sources that comprise of bulky wastes, consumer electronics, white goods, yard wastes that are collected separately, batteries, oil, and tires. These wastes are usually handled separately from other residential and commercial wastes.

e) **Bulky Waste**

- Shall refer to waste materials which cannot be appropriately placed in separate containers because of either its bulky size, shape or other physical attributes. These include large worn-out or broken household, commercial, and industrial items such as furniture, lamps, bookcases, filing cabinets, and other similar items.

SECTION 10. MANDATORY SEGREGATION OF SOLID WASTE. The segregation shall be mandatory, and shall be primarily conducted by the generators at the source, to include households, institutional, industrial, commercial and agricultural sources based on waste classification provided under Section 9. **No segregation - No Collection Policy will be implemented.**

SECTION 11. REQUIREMENT FOR WASTE SEGREGATION. Households and establishments shall have separate receptacles or containers (i.e. sacks, bins, boxes, cans, bags, etc.) for each type of solid waste inside their household or business premises. The solid waste receptacle, depending on its use, shall be properly marked or identified for on-site collection as "BIODEGRADABLE/MALATA", "NON-BIODEGRADABLE/DILI MALATA", "RE-USABLE/RECYCLABLE" and/or "SPECIAL WASTE." The receptacles shall be properly covered, secured or protected to prevent spillage or scattering of the waste and to ensure its containment.

SECTION 12. HIERARCHY OF SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT. All households and waste generators must observe the following Solid Waste Management practices (according to its order of priority):

- a) **Source Reduction** - reduce waste by using products with less packaging and with reusable materials;
- b) **Re-Use** - reduce waste by reusing materials like plastic bags, paper, glass, metals and other reusable waste materials;
- c) **Recycle** - reduce waste by selling and transforming recyclable waste into materials that can be a means of livelihood to the household of this barangay;
- d) **Composting** - reduce waste by converting food left-overs, kitchen wastes, fruit peelings, dried leaves, vegetable peelings and the like into compost; and
- e) **Disposal** - must be the last option. Waste that cannot be reused, recycled or composted must be segregated and disposed properly.

SECTION 13. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PREMISES CONTAINING SIX (6) OR MORE RESIDENTIAL UNITS. The owner or person in charge of premises containing six (6) or more residential units shall provide for the residents a designated area and containers in which to accumulate source separated recyclable materials for collection. In addition, such owner or person in charge shall notify or inform the residents or occupants of such premises of the requirements of segregation.

SECTION 14. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL COMMERCIAL, INSTITUTIONAL AND INDUSTRIAL ESTABLISHMENTS. The owners or heads of all commercial, institutional and industrial establishments shall provide a designated area and containers in which to accumulate source segregated solid waste for collection. In addition, such owner or head of the institution shall notify all workers, employees, and entities working in the premises of the requirements of segregation. No scavenging or unauthorized collection in designated segregation containers or areas shall be allowed by the owners or heads of establishments

SECTION 15. WASTE STORAGE, COLLECTION SYSTEM AND DROP-OFF POINTS. All households and establishments must have a designated strategic collection or drop-off points to facilitate hauling or collection of segregated waste materials. **All wastes for collection must be stored in properly sealed/tied receptacles** and brought outside households, institutions, commercial and industrial establishments and other sources **during collection time only**. Otherwise, the presence of these wastes outside of the scheduled collection time and especially if left on the ground and not placed inside the appropriate container, will be considered as a violation of the anti-littering provision of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE IV
WASTE PROCESSING AND RESOURCE RECOVERY

SECTION 16. ESTABLISHMENT OF BARANGAY MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY (BMRF). A Barangay Materials Recovery Facility (BMRF) shall be established to receive mixed non-biodegradable wastes for final segregation, re-use and recycling. Provided, that each type of mixed waste is collected from the source and transported to the MRF in separate containers. The minimum size of the MRF is One Meter by Three Meters (1m x 3m).

SECTION 17. BACKYARD COMPOSTING. Aside from the Barangay Material Recovery Facility (BMRF) all household are encouraged to establish a space to do backyard composting by establishing compost heaps and bins. All households are required to actively participate the Barangay Program "UTANON KADA BALAY PROGRAM."

ARTICLE V
FINANCING THE BARANGAY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

SECTION 18. FUNDING SOURCE FOR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM. Funding for the projects and activities of the Barangay Solid Waste Management Program shall be sourced out from the following:

- a) Ten percent (10%) of the annual Barangay Development Fund shall be allocated to fund the SWM Program starting Fiscal Year 2021 and thereafter;
- b) Donations, endowments, grants and contributions from domestic and foreign sources;
- c) The barangay share or allocation in the fines collected from violations of RA 9003, City Ordinance No. 36, this Ordinance, and other legal basis; and
- d) Fees collected from provision of solid waste services such as collection, recycling, and transport among others.

SECTION 19. COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES. The Barangay shall impose fees for collection and segregation of biodegradable, compostable and reusable wastes from households, commerce other sources of domestic wastes, and for the use of Barangay MRFs. The computation of the fees and the manner of collection of the fees shall be established by the BESWMC after adequate consultation with the constituents.

ARTICLE VI
SPECIAL PROVISION

SECTION 20. ISSUANCE OF ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT CLEARANCE. All sari-sari store, commercial, institutional establishments and agricultural businesses shall secure an Ecological Solid Waste Management Clearance/Certificate, which will be issued by the Barangay Secretary of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City. The Ecological Solid Waste Management Clearance/Certificate will serve as a proof that the owner/manager has undergone orientation on Ecological Solid Waste Management conducted by the barangay and the Local Government Unit of Ormoc City.

ARTICLE VII
PENAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 21. PROHIBITED ACTS AND PENALTIES. The following acts are prohibited under this Ordinance and shall be penalized as follows:

21.1. Indiscriminately Dumping of Garbage, Littering, Throwing, Dumping of Solid Waste Matters in Public Places such as Roads, Sidewalks, Canals, Drainage Systems, Curbs and Gutters, Creeks, Rivers, Tributaries, Rivulets and other Natural Waterways, or causing or permitting the same;

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City.

21.2. Open Burning of Solid Wastes Including Tires and Plastics in any forms;

- First offense - PhP 200.00
- Second offense - PhP 400.00
- Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 800.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City.

21.3. Open dumping, burying of biodegradable or non-biodegradable materials;

- First offense - PhP 300.00
- Second offense - PhP 500.00
- Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 1,000.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City.

21.4. Non-segregation and non-sorting of solid waste.

- First offense - PhP 300.00
- Second offense - PhP 500.00
- Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 1,000.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City.

21.5. The manufacture, distribution, or use of non-environmentally acceptable packaging materials during the scheduled "NO PLASTIC DAYS" of the City of Ormoc.

- First offense - PhP 500.00
- Second offense - PhP 800.00
- Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 1,000.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City.

21.6. Establishment or Operation of Open Dumps for Solid Waste.

- First offense - PhP 500.00
- Second offense - PhP 800.00
- Third & succeeding Offense - PhP 1,000.00

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine half of the penalty prescribed for offenses committed at the Barangay Treasurer of Barangay District 6, Ormoc City.

SECTION 22. VIOLATIONS OF THE ORDINANCE. The following procedure shall be observed in case of violation of the Ordinance;

- 22.1. Apprehension;
- 22.2. Issuance of Citation Ticket and/or Official Receipt;
- 22.3. Payment of fine at the Barangay Treasurer;
- 22.4. Filing of case in court, if necessary.

**ARTICLE VIII
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

SECTION 23. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason, any provision, portion or part of this ordinance is found to be inconsistent with any law, other provisions or part or parts thereof not so affected shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 24. REPEALING OR AMENDATORY CLAUSE. All ordinances, rules, and regulations or part or parts thereof, which are inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, amended and or modified accordingly.


SECTION 25. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval and posting in conspicuous places in this barangay as required under the Local Government Code.
