

AND SIGN THE ATTACHED TERMS OF PARTNERSHIP  
(TOP) TO BE EXECUTED BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY  
GOVERNMENT OF ORMOC AND THE DEPARTMENT OF  
HEALTH-EASTERN VISAYAS CENTER FOR HEALTH  
DEVELOPMENT FOR THE ANNUAL OPERATIONAL  
PLAN CY 2022**

WHEREAS, this Fifteenth Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an Endorsement dated March 07, 2022 from the Office of the City Mayor, endorsing the herein request for issuance of a Resolution granting the City Mayor or his representative, the authority to sign the TERMS OF PARTNERSHIP (TOP) to be executed by and between the City Government of Ormoc and the Department of Health-Eastern Visayas Center for Health Development for the Annual Operational Plan CY 2022. Further, requesting that this matter be treated as EXTREMELY URGENT, a copy of the TOP is hereto attached as "ANNEX A" and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, in an annotation dated March 07, 2022, the City Legal Office finds nothing legally objectionable in the said TERMS OF PARTNERSHIP and that the same is not contrary to law, morals, public order, or public policy much less detrimental to the best interest of Ormoc City;

WHEREAS, Section 11, Article XIII of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides, among others, that the State shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development, which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and social services available to all people at affordable cost;

WHEREAS, Republic Act 7160 otherwise known as the 1991 Local Government Code mandated the devolution of the delivery of health services and facilities as one of the basic functions and responsibilities of all Local Government Units (LGUs) at all levels;

WHEREAS, Section 22 of Republic Act 11223 otherwise known as the Universal Health Care (UHC) Act 2019 mandated the National Government to make available commensurate financial and non-financial matching grants, including capital outlay, human resources for health and health commodities, to improve the functionality of city-wide health systems, provided that the grants shall be in accordance with the approved city-wide health investment plans;

WHEREAS, the Formula One Plus for Health with its tagline "Boosting Health Care" is the strategic framework for Health Sector Reform to attain the goals outlined by the Philippine Government in the Philippine Development Plan, the Sustainable Development Goals, and The Ambisyon Natin 2040, specifically for the health sector, goals of better health outcomes, more equitable health care financing, and more responsive health system;

WHEREAS, the City of Ormoc has agreed to implement health sector reforms consistent with the Universal Health Care Act and the Formula One Plus for Health and has proven its capacity to utilize investment and sustain the reform process, among others;


WHEREAS, the Local Investment Plan for HEALTH (LIPH) is the key instrument in forging the Department of Health (DOH) and Local Government unit (LGU) partnership to carry out the Formula One Plus for Health, and technical assistance from the DOH shall be consolidated and matched with the needs outlined in the Local Investment Plans for Health; and whereas the implementation of the LIPH is translated through the Annual Operation Plans;

WHEREAS, the City, in partnership with their component LGU's have agreed to fund and implement the programs, projects and activities under their respective LIPHs/AOPs through their own financing source, and through available funds and resources from the DOH, and development partners, coordinated with the DOH;

WHEREAS, the City of Ormoc has prepared its 2020-2022 LIPH, and 2022 Annual Operational Plan (AOP), which have been reviewed by the City and DOH-EV CHD Appraisal Committee, and modified as necessary following the recommendations above;

WHEREAS, the Year 2022 is a milestone year as it ushers in a new era in health sector development, with the implementation of Executive Order No. 138 on full devolutions to the LGU, as enshrined in Sections 3 and 7 of Republic Act 7160 or the Government Code (LGC) of 1991, and the execution of the Supreme Court Mandanas-Garcia ruling increasing the share of LGUs in national taxes;

WHEREAS, the subject TOP clearly and plainly encapsulate the terms and conditions of the agreement of the parties thereto, including their specific roles and obligations towards the attainment of the lofty ends of the same, and this Sangunian, upon thorough review, finds that the same is entered into for the best interest of the City and its constituents, and therefore, is most deserving of this august Body's prompt and favorable action;

Rama, Gregorio G. Yrastorza III and Lalaine A. Marcos; be it



TERMS OF PARTNERSHIP

(Annual Operational Plan CY 2022)

KNOW ALL MEN BY THIS PRESENTS:

This Terms of Partnership (TOP) is made and entered by and between:

The Department of Health – Eastern Visayas Center for Health Development, a regional government agency created and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines with principal office address at Government Center, Brgy. Candahug, Palo, Leyte herein represented by the Director IV, Government Center, Brgy. Candagug, Palo, Leyte, and hereinafter referred to as the “DOH-EV CHD”;

and

The City of Ormoc, a Local Government Unit established and existing under the laws and regulations of the Republic of the Philippines, with principal office address at Ormoc City Hall Building Dalingding Street, Government Center, Ormoc City, Leyte represented by HON. RICHARD I. GOMEZ, in his capacity as the City Mayor, as duly authorized by the Sangguniang Panlungsod under Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_ dated \_\_\_\_\_, hereinafter referred to as the “CITY”;

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Section 11, Article XIII of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides, among others, that the State shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development, which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and social services available to all people at affordable cost;

WHEREAS, the City of Ormoc has prepared its 2020-2022 LIPH, and 2022 Annual Operational Plan (AOP), which have been reviewed by the City and DOH-EV CHD Appraisal Committee, and modified as necessary following the recommendations of the above;

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing premises, and by way of formalizing and confirming the commitment of the City and the DOH-EV CHD, the parties hereby agree to enter into agreement in accordance with the terms and conditions hereunder set forth:

## ARTICLE I IMPLEMENTATION ARRANGEMENT

### 1.1 Program Coverage

This agreement shall cover the management and implementation of the approved 2022 AOP (Annex), and shall focus on the achievement of improved local health system performance consistent with the UHC Act and Fourmula One Plus For Health.

### 1.2 Roles and Responsibilities

#### A. The City shall:

The City hereby adheres to an integrated and phased implementation of the UHC Act and 2020-2022 LIPH, as embodied in the approved 2022 AOP, and commits to the principles and conditions set forth and to this end, shall:

1. Issue executive instruments or local legislations, whenever necessary, for the effective implementation of the UHC Act and 2020-2022 LIPH, through the approved 2022 AOP;
2. Secure the participation and cooperation of its component LGUs in carrying out local initiatives or activities pursuant to a city-wide implementation of the UHC Act and 2020-2022 LIPH, through the approved 2022 AOP, to include but not limited to:
  - 2.1 Secure increased, better and sustained financing for health from DOH, PhilHealth and LGU appropriations;
  - 2.2 Assure the quality and affordability of health goods and services through DOH licensing and PhilHealth accreditation;
  - 2.3 Ensure access to and availability of essential and basic health packages by matching its catchment population to appropriate Primary Care Provider Network and through effective referral systems;
  - 2.4 Ensure delivery of population-based health services
    - 2.4.1 Improve performance of the health system, measured through accurate, sensitive and timely epidemiologic surveillance systems and other monitoring and evaluation systems;
    - 2.4.2 Proactive, effective and evidence-based health promotion programs or campaigns;
    - 2.4.3 Timely, effective and efficient preparedness and response to public health emergencies and disasters;
    - 2.4.4 Environment health services
    - 2.4.5 Services for diseases elimination
  - 2.5 Improve human resources for health management and development;
  - 2.6 Improve information management/EMR;
  - 2.7 Mitigate public health threats and pandemic such as COVID19.
3. Allocate, release and utilize, together with its component LGUs, funds that are necessary for the city-wide implementation of the approved 2022 AOP;
  - 3.1 Be guided by the approved 2022 AOP in the disbursement of funds;
  - 3.2 Establish and maintain a "Trust Fund Account for Health" in a government depository bank, for the fund releases, provided that separate ledgers and/or sub-ledgers shall be maintained by the City for each and every type of fund transfer;
  - 3.3 For UHC-IS, establish and maintain a *Special Health Fund* account, in a government depository bank for the fund releases, provided that separate book of accounts, ledgers and/or sub-ledgers shall be maintained by the City for each and every type of fund transfer subject to the provisions of Joint Memorandum Circular 2021-0001 on Special Health Fund;

- 3.4 Ensure all funds, including grants proceeds and counterpart, shall flow directly to the City Trust Fund Account for Health or the Special Health Fund Account, as appropriate, and/or shall be automatically appropriated for the implementation of the approved 2022 AOP;  
3.3.1 Assure that adequate funds shall be made available to support/enable the progressive realization of UHC;

3.4 Ensure compliance with existing COA rules and regulations.
4. Take all steps in meeting the technical requirements and operational conditions that are pre-requisites for the release of grants for specific programs, which include but not limited to;  
4.1 Prepare and submit, in a timely manner/within the deadline set/agreed, to the DOH-EV CHD Monitoring Reports and Fund Utilization/Liquidation Reports;  
4.2 Upgrade/enhance the administrative and operational capabilities of its local health facilities to conform to the existing accreditation and licensing standards;  
4.3 Be responsible for the compliance with all applicable procedures, rules and regulations, environmental and zoning laws and regulations, and that all necessary licenses and permits are obtained prior to the commencement of civil works;

5. Manage the program resources and ensure the delivery of inputs (e.g. rehabilitation works, equipment, Human Resource for Health deployment, commodities, capacity building, etc.) to the lower levels of local government to produce required outputs;

6. Contribute to and facilitate monitoring, evaluation, and conduct of internal audit activities in the course of the program. that shall be conducted in the course of the program;  
6.1 Submit the accomplishment/monitoring reports required by the DOH in a timely manner/within the deadline set/agreed.
- B. The Department of Health –Eastern Visayas Center for Health Development (DOH-EV CHD) shall:

1. Coordinate/facilitate the support from National Government Agencies (NGAs) and their instrumentalities, and development partners, to the city for the implementation of the approved 2022 AOP;  
1.1 Maintain stewardship function over DOH funds provided to the city to support attainment of goals and objectives of the approved 2022 AOP;

2. Issue the necessary policies to mobilize its offices to assist in the city-wide implementation of the approved 2022 AOP;

3. Advocate for the issuance of local executive policies or legislative enactments by the LGUs that are necessary for the implementation of the approved 2022 AOP;

4. Deliver the necessary technical assistance (TA) to the city;  
4.1 Provide logistical and technical support to the city for the overall planning, management, coordination and implementation of priority activities and programs;  
4.2 Assist in building the capacity of the city;

5. Undertake monitoring of the implementation of the approved 2022 AOP;

6. Facilitate and arrange the provision and release of grants within the DOH-EV CHD Director’s authority and control:  
6.1 Ensure the timely release of DOH-EV CHD funds to the city and/or to component LGUs when necessary, based on the verified physical, financial, and technical accomplishment reports;  
6.2 Release the funds and commodities to the city based on the guidelines issued by the DOH or by joint agencies such as the Joint Memorandum Circular 2021-0001 on Special Health Fund; as applicable;  
6.3 Authorize the city to manage the DOH-EV CHD fund transferred and commodities in the implementation of the approved 2022 AOP for the deliverables and outputs indicated in this Agreement, cash transfers and support in kind (commodities) as it implements the approved 2022 AOP to produce the deliverables and outputs indicated in this Agreement;  
6.4 Ensure compliance with existing COA rules and regulations.

ARTICLE II  
RESOURCES AND FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

2.1 Resources from National Government and Local Government Unit

2.1.1 The City shall receive an estimated allocation of **Php 89,534,142.50** support (financial and non-financial grants) from the National Government-DOH for the implementation of the approved 2022 AOP, details of which is shown in Table 1.

2.1.2 Program Funding

The implementation of the approved **2022 AOP** shall be funded by various sources which may include the following: 1) Local Government Unit Funds, 2) Fund transfers from the DOH-EV CHD, 3) Support in kind or commodities from the DOH regular budget of the Central Office, coursed through the DOH-EV CHD, 4) PhilHealth payments, and 5) Other funds identified by DOH-EV CHD and LGU, including funds from development partners, and other stakeholders.

2.2 Financial Arrangements

2.2.1 Uses of Fixed Tranche:  
Assistance to ICC primarily for the development, planning, encoding and monitoring of their Local Investment Plans for Health (LIPH)/Annual Operational Plans (AOP) and integration of local health systems into City-wide Health Systems (CWHS)

- Other uses:
- Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (GIDA)/ Indigenous Cultural Communities/ Indigenous Peoples (ICC/IPs)/ Urban Poor activities/ projects to improve availability and access to health care through the Health Care Provider Network;
  - For ICC: Data collection for equity assessment/ measurement;
  - LGU Health Scorecard implementation
  - Activities in support of identification, documentation and replication of Good Practices
  - Support interventions to strengthen the systems, operations and capacity of the Local Health Board (e.g. capacity building of LHB members, mentoring and coaching sessions, support for leadership and governance for health meetings/activities);

6. Barangay Health Workers (BHW) capacity development (e.g. trainings, orientations, TESDA application and accreditation as applicable, etc.), logistics (e.g. face masks, gloves, face shield, alcohol, sanitizers, first aid kit, thermometer, sphygmomanometer, etc.), financial support (e.g. incentives, allowance for trainings), and recognition (e.g. awarding); and
7. COVID-19 and Emerging and Re-emerging Infectious Diseases (EREID) response/control/interventions.

2.2.2 The LGU counterpart shall be based on the approved 2022 AOP which is included by the city & its Barangays in their Annual Investment Plans (AIP), as per DILG, NEDA, DBM and DOF Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1, Series of 2016: Updated Guidelines on the Harmonization of Local Planning, Investment Programming, Resource Mobilization, Budgeting, Expenditure Management, and Performance Monitoring and Coordination in Fiscal Oversight;

2.2.3 Transfer/use of funds or commodities shall adhere to the DOH guidelines for the Work and Financial Plan, Joint Memorandum Circular 2021-0001 on Special Health Fund and technical guidelines on the release and transfer of resources from the National Government to City Local Government Units, and specify the sources and uses of the resources including the expected outputs/deliverables;

2.2.4 In the event that additional financial grants shall be provided but were not indicated in the AOP and TOP, the CHO shall submit a Work and Financial Plan or a supplemental AOP for approval of the EV CHD Director, provided that the WFP has been reviewed by the concerned EV CHD program manager following the appropriate DOH Guidelines issued. Said WFP/supplemental AOP shall be attached to the TOP for the release of grants.

2.2.5 The LGU shall submit a copy of "Certification by the Accountant that funds previously transferred to the Implementing Agency (IA) has been liquidated and accounted for in the books" (per COA Circular 2016-002 dated 31 May 2016) to the DOH-EV CHD before the end of Quarter 2 of the succeeding year and to refund expenditures disallowed by audit;

2.2.6 In the event that the LGU fails to liquidate the previously transferred DOH funds within the prescribed timelines, the DOH-EV CHD shall manage or co-manage the funds based on the approved AOP or Work and Financial Plan for FT funds or return the same to the National Treasury in accordance with existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Moreover, fund utilization of the LGU may be one of the bases for the increase/decrease in the computation of its Fixed Tranche for the succeeding years.

2.2.7 All fund transfers, disbursements, utilization and accounting of resources shall strictly adhere to all government budgeting, accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

### ARTICLE III

#### Miscellaneous

##### 3.1 Mutual Obligations

The DOH-EV CHD and the City agree to perform, fulfill, abide by, and submit to any and all of the provisions and requirements and all matters related, contained or expressed or reasonably inferred from this Agreement. All unobligated amounts from DOH support funds shall be applied according to modalities determined by the DOH-EV CHD and City subject to existing budgeting, accounting, and auditing rules. The city shall abide by the decisions of the DOH-EV CHD in this regard.

##### 3.2 Duration and Effectivity

The DOH-EV CHD and the City agree that the provisions herein described shall cover activities from January to December 2022.

This Agreement shall be terminated upon satisfactory fulfillment of all the terms and conditions embodied herein but not later than June 30, 2023. Any modification or amendments to this Agreement as proposed by either party shall mutually be agreed upon in writing by all the parties hereto.

##### 3.3 Notices
