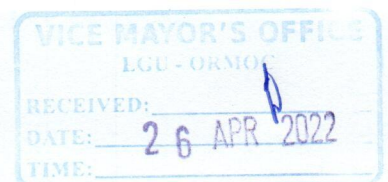
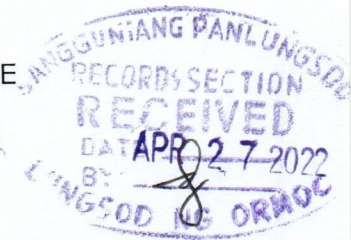

**A RESOLUTION GRANTING AUTHORITY TO THE CITY
MAYOR RICHARD I. GOMEZ OR THE ACTING CITY
MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AND SIGN THE
MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH UNIFY,
INC. RELATIVE TO THE STRENGTHENING OF YOUTH
INVOLVEMENT IN THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT
GOALS FRAMEWORK AT THE LOCAL LEVEL**

WHEREAS, this Fifteenth Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an Indorsement dated April 25, 2022 from the Office of the City Mayor, endorsing a request for the issuance of a Resolution granting the City Mayor or Acting City Mayor the authority to sign the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with UNIFY, Inc. relative to the strengthening of youth involvement in the Sustainable Development Goals Framework at the local level. Further requesting that this matter be treated as EXTREMELY URGENT, a copy of the MOA is hereto attached as "ANNEX A" and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, in an Annotation dated April 25, 2022 the City Legal Office finds nothing legally objectionable in the said MOA and that the same is not contrary to law, morals, public order, or public policy much less detrimental to the best interests of Ormoc City;

WHEREAS, UNIFY, Inc. is a national youth organization that operates in the entire Philippines and is annexed as the national chapter for a global movement with the United Nations;

WHEREAS, UNIFY, Inc. is an accredited Civil Society Organization (CSO) in accordance with Ormoc City Ordinance No. 009 entitled "Procedure for the Accreditation of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) in the City of Ormoc;

WHEREAS, UNIFY, Inc. communicated with the City Government of Ormoc to establish a partnership for the implementation of their youth programs, all of which are focused on strengthening the involvement of the youth in the Sustainable Development Goals Framework at the local level;

WHEREAS, the subject MOA clearly and plainly encapsulates the terms and conditions of the agreement of the parties thereto, including their specific roles and obligations towards the attainment of the lofty ends of the same, and this Sanggunian, upon thorough review, finds that the same is entered into for the purpose of strengthening youth involvement in the framework of sustainable development, thereby, serving the best interests of the City and its constituents, and therefore, is most deserving of this august Body's prompt and favorable consideration;

WHEREFORE, on joint motion of SP Member Nolito M. Quilang, Chairperson, Committee on Laws and Ordinances and SP Member Joan Marbie C. Simbajon, Chairperson, Committee on Youth & Sports Development, severally seconded by SP Members Tomas R. Serafica, Roiland H. Villasencio, Peter M. Rodriguez, Gregorio G. Yrastorza III, Lalaine A. Marcos and Esteban V. Laurente; be it

RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to pass A RESOLUTION GRANTING AUTHORITY TO THE CITY MAYOR RICHARD I. GOMEZ OR THE ACTING CITY MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AND SIGN THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH UNIFY, INC. RELATIVE TO THE STRENGTHENING OF YOUTH INVOLVEMENT IN THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS FRAMEWORK AT THE LOCAL LEVEL;



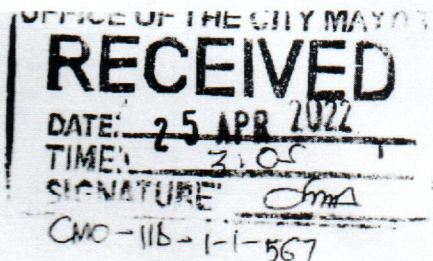

"Annex A"

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT



KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This agreement is made and executed by and between:

UNIFY, Inc., a juridical entity registered in accordance with existing laws, with principal place of business at _____, herein represented by Angelica Cariman, Assistant Treasurer, and hereinafter referred to as the **FIRST PARTY**; -and-

The **CITY OF ORMOC**, a government political subdivision, created under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with office address at the New City Hall, Brgy. Cogon, Ormoc City, represented in this instance by its City Mayor Hon. Richard I. Gomez, hereinafter referred to as the **SECOND PARTY**.

WITNESSETH, that:

WHEREAS, the **FIRST PARTY** is a national youth organization that operates in the entire Philippines and is annexed as the national chapter for a global movement with the United Nations;

WHEREAS, the **FIRST PARTY** is an accredited civil society organization (CSO) with the **SECOND PARTY** in accordance with Ormoc City Ordinance No. 009 entitled "Procedure for the Accreditation of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) in the City of Ormoc" and enacted into law on October 29, 2014;

WHEREAS, the **FIRST PARTY** communicated with the **SECOND PARTY** to establish a partnership for the implementation of their youth, all of which are focused on strengthening the involvement of the youth in the Sustainable Development Goals Framework at the local level;

WHEREAS, the following sections of the Local Government Code express the mandate of local government units with respect to CSOs,

Section 34. *Role of People's and Non-governmental Organizations.* - Local government units shall promote the establishment and operation of people's and non-governmental organizations to become active partners in the pursuit of local autonomy.

Section 35. *Linkages with People's and Non-governmental Organizations.* - Local government units may enter into joint ventures and such other cooperative arrangements with people's and non-governmental organizations to engage in the delivery of certain basic services, capability-building and livelihood projects, and to develop local enterprises designed to improve productivity and income, diversity agriculture, spur rural industrialization, promote ecological balance, and enhance the economic and social well-being of the people.

Section 36. *Assistance to People's and Non-governmental Organizations.* - A local government unit may, through its local chief executive and with the concurrence of the sanggunian concerned, provide assistance, financial or otherwise, to such people's and non-governmental organizations for economic, socially-oriented, environmental, or cultural projects to be implemented within its territorial jurisdiction.

WHEREAS, Section 9.2. of Ormoc City Ordinance No. 009; states that, "Enjoy preference on receiving grants, assistance, financial or the like, from LGU Ormoc for economic, socially oriented, environmental, or cultural projects or programs to be implemented within the territorial jurisdiction of the City, subject to availability of funds and the usual accounting and auditing procedures."

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the above premises, the parties hereby agree, as follows:

a. **OBLIGATIONS OF THE FIRST PARTY.**

The FIRST PARTY shall do the following:

1. Orient youth organizations and their members on sustainable development goals (SDGs), and train them how to align their projects, programs and activities (PPAs) with the priorities of the local government based on the SDGs;
2. Help and assist youth organizations refine their existing PPAs to target SDGs, which will be reviewed by a subject matter expert associated with a United Nations agency.;
3. Train and equip youth leaders to become highly capable of differentiating Climate Change from Climate Crisis and Climate Action;
4. Refine existing PPAs related to Climate Action Planning, for it to be sustainable and and anle contribute to the reduction of climate anxiety;
5. To develop youth leaders become members of the biggest International Youth Movement for Climate Crisis;
6. Organize and host an international gathering for the youth to discuss water and climate concerns, at a city-wide level, which will qualify youth leaders to participate in and attend the UNIFY Gathering in Egypt in December 2022;
7. Issue acknowledgement/official receipt (OR) and utilized the funds transferred by the SECOND PARTY, strictly in accordance with this agreement, and subject to the applicable laws, rules and regulations and comply with sound accounting practices;
8. Liquidate all funds transferred and received by it in accordance with existing laws and Commission on Audit rules and regulations;
9. Return to the SECOND PARTY any unused balance upon completion of the project; and
10. Such other acts and representations necessary for the accomplishment of the all the foregoing.

b. OBLIGATIONS OF THE SECOND PARTY.

The SECOND PARTY shall do the following:

1. Provide the amount needed for the FIRST PARTY to perform and execute its undertaking under this agreement and as proposed in its concept note dated March 24, 2022; and
2. Upon approval thereof, and provided there exists the necessary appropriation ordinance relative thereto, release the funds made the subject of this agreement.

c. TERMINATION.

The SECOND PARTY reserves the right to rescind, terminate, revoke the Agreement for a violation by the FIRST PARTY of its obligations and/or for grounds otherwise provided by law. Any termination of this Agreement shall be without prejudice to rights and liabilities, which have accrued under this Agreement the date of termination, or with respect to any antecedent breach of the terms hereof, prior to termination, or any amount owing or due under this Agreement.

d. EFFECTIVITY.

This Memorandum of Agreement shall take effect upon signing/ approval of the parties hereto and shall automatically terminate upon completion by the parties of their respective undertakings, unless sooner terminated or revoked.
