A RESOLUTION GRANTING AUTHORITY TO THE CITY MAYOR, RICHARD I. GOMEZ, OR THE ACTING CITY MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AND SIGN A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT OF ORMOC (LGU-ORMOC) WITH THE BILIRAN PROVINCE STATE UNIVERSITY (BIPSU) TO ESTABLISH MUTUAL COOPERATION AND ASSISTANCE TO THE ORMOC CITY GOVERNMENT SCHOLARS ENROLLED AT BIPSU

WHEREAS, an indorsement was forwarded to this august Body from the Office of the City Mayor, dated April 22, 2022, requesting for authority to enter into and sign the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with Biliran Province State University (BiPSU) relative to the City Academic Scholarship Program. A copy of the said MOA is hereto attached as "ANNEX A" and made an integral part hereof;

WHEREAS, BiPSU is a premier state university in the Province of Biliran, Eastern Visayas, Philippines. At present, BiPSU continues to mark a name in the academic and educational sphere among institutions in the country and soar high in its quest for excellence and quality education. Proof to that is the university's commendable accomplishments in the field of instruction, research, extension and production services;

WHEREAS, the scholarship program of Ormoc City is geared to help those who do not have more in life to benefit the most from said program and eventually empowering them both economically and socially to be able to fully participate and contribute in our democratic nation;



WHEREAS, the Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991 expressly provides that a local government unit may exercise the powers essential to the promotion of the general welfare and shall ensure and support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants;

WHEREAS, both BiPSU and LGU-Ormoc are desirous of entering into the agreement to establish mutual cooperation and assistance in helping the scholars comply with both academic requirements of the school and requirements of the City Scholarship Program pursuant to relevant ordinances;

WHEREAS, the signing of the aforesaid Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signifies the commitment of the parties to continually uphold the general welfare of the people and uphold the constitutional mandate of the state to protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels, and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all;

WHEREAS, the subject MOA clearly and plainly encapsulates the terms and conditions of the agreement of the parties thereto, including their specific roles and obligations towards the attainment of the lofty ends of the same;

WHEREAS, this Sanggunian, upon thorough review, finds that the MOA is not contrary to law, public policy, contracts, morals and public order and is extremely favorable and advantageous to the institution and the communities that both parties are serving and is therefore most deserving of this august body's prompt and favorable consideration;

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into by and between:

The CITY GOVERNMENT UNIT OF ORMOC, a municipal corporation created and existing under Philippine laws, with address at Aunubing Street, Brgy. Cogon, Ormoc City, represented by Mayor RICHARD I. GOMEZ, hereinafter referred to as the FIRST PARTY; and

The **BILIRAN PROVINCE STATE UNIVERSITY**, represented in this instance by VICTOR C. CAÑEZO, Jr., EdD, President, hereinafter referred to as the SECOND PARTY.

WITNESSETH, THAT:

WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY recognizes the need to provide opportunities to those coming from the underprivileged sector to improve their socio-economic condition;

WHEREAS, consistent with the government policy to make education accessible to the underprivileged, the FIRST PARTY provides scholarships and educational assistance to the underserved but deserving students in order to harness their potential and ability to contribute to the development goals of the country;

WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY enacted Ordinance No. 028, Series of 2017 and entitled the "Ormoc City Scholarship Program", which provides the funds therefor, defines the qualifications and standards for academic subsidy and allowance, and institutionalizes the city scholarship program;

WHEREAS, the SECOND PARTY, a public Higher Education Institution established under Republic Act No. 11170, with principal office at P. Inocentes St., P.I. Garcia, Naval, Biliran, aiming to become a state university leading in research and innovation for human empowerment and societal development;

WHEREAS, both parties are desirous of entering into this agreement to establish mutual cooperation and assistance in helping the grantees comply with the requirements of the school and requirements of the City Scholarship Program, subject to the terms and conditions set forth;

NOW TREEFORE, and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the parties to this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) do hereby covenant and agree to the following terms and conditions:

A. OBLIGATIONS OF THE FIRST PARTY

purpose of monitoring "performance of grantees and keep track of them, especially after their availment of the benefits of the program", and for the purpose of the enforcement of the provisions of the Ormoc City Scholarship Program.

B. OBLIGATIONS OF THE SECOND PARTY

The SECOND PARTY shall:

- Designate a SCHOLARSHIP COORDINATOR to assist the grantees in complying with the terms and conditions of the scholarship and coordinate or assist the ESO in addressing issues and concerns affecting the grantees;
- Furnish the FIRST PARTY with grade reports and such other documents needed by its 2. current students who are applying for scholarship with the First Party;
- Submit to the FIRST PARTY the academic grades of the all grantees, certification on community involvement and such other documents, pertinent and relevant to this MOA and the Ormoc City Scholarship Program, and not later than THIRTY (30) days from the close of every semester/term:
- Assist the grantees in complying with the terms and conditions specified under the scholarship contract especially in ensuring that grantees do not drop any of their subjects, that they take the prescribed subjects per semester and that incomplete grades are avoided, any and all which is a ground for the termination of scholarship; and
- Coordinate with the FIRST PARTY through the ESO, grantees who are facing problems such as dropping from school, those involved in any crime or offense or those violating school rules and regulations, and similar others.

C. COMMON PROVISIONS

The parties will implement such measures as may be necessary to the end that all grantees under the Ormoc City Scholarship Program are able to observe the following terms as a prerequisite to continuation of scholarship

- To continue the full benefit under the Ormoc City Scholarship Program, the grantee for an 1. academic degree shall comply with the following scholastic requirements:
- Maintain a semestral average of 2.0 or 85%;
- b. Must not fail in any subject;
- Have not dropped any subject; C.
- d. Must not have an incomplete grade in any subject.
- The grantee should not stop schooling in any semester of his/her 4-5 year course, except 2. for meritorious reasons such as illness, injury or other circumstances that are beyond the control of the grantee subject to the verification and approval of the scholarship board and subject further to school rules and regulations.
- The grantee shall enroll in full/regular load each semester as prescribed by the curriculum of the chosen course.

4 Except when required by the course curriculum, a grantee may enroll in summer classes at his/her own expense. Monthly stipend shall not be provided under the City Scholarship Program. ORMOECTY LEGATO Case of any delay in the release of grades, enrollment shall be allowed for the succeeding

semester subject to the condition that grades shall be submitted to the ESO within the succeeding ADDSGREESter. Any delay in the grades should be settled within the succeeding semester otherwise it is assumed to be a failing grade. In cases where all the grades are submitted within the succeeding Sepsements, and the grantee failed to comply with the scholastic requirements, the grantee shall be allowed to finish the semester after which the scholarship support shall automatically end and the Drafted by Cto is terminated from the scholarship program.

SHIFTING OF COURSE - A grantee may be allowed to shift to another course only once Not contrain to the Scholarship Board. It is a policy moral rion that the grantee completes the new course within the duration of the original course. No extension shall be allowed. It is a requirement that the second course chosen must also be in the Amhinion City Scholarship Ordinance.

- 7. TRANSFER OF SCHOOL A grantee shall not be allowed to transfer to another school during the duration of the course for which he/ she was extended a grant under the Ormoc City Scholarship Program.
- 8. COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT A grantee shall actively participate in a community project and is encouraged to be active in social involvement activities of the school.

The grantee shall submit the following every after end of the semester:

- a. Authenticated copy of final grades every after end of the semester;
- b. Certification from school that the grantee has not participated in any offense involving moral turpitude;
- c. Certification from Dean's office that the grantee has participated in community service and activities of the Grantee's Organization.

D. EFFECTIVITY

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) shall take effect immediately and after this agreement has been completely executed with parties herein affixing their signatures, and shall continue to be in force and effect until mutually revoked or terminated by the parties.

Either party may terminate this Agreement should there be a clear breach of the terms and conditions of the agreement, or in case any of the parties fail to fulfill its obligations under this agreement upon prior written notice to the other and shall take effect thirty (30) days after receipt of said notice. Rights already accrued under this agreement prior to the receipt by one party of the notice shall not be prejudiced by the proposed or actual termination.

E. CONFIDENTIALITY

The parties will ensure that safeguards will be put into place so that any information gathered during the processing of hisburstments under this agreement will maintain its integrity and accuracy, as well as its strict contidentiality in accordance with R.A. No. 10173, the Data Privacy Act of 2012 and other laws, rules, and regulations.

F. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

The provisions of Ordinance No. 028 Series of 2017, insofar as portions thereof are not included in this agreement, are automatically incorporated herein including its amendments. Any and all conditions in this agreement as are inconsistent with Ordinance No. 028 Series of 2017, are automatically revoked.
